THE UNIVERSITY

Philosophy of the University

As a centre of learning, the Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto shall promote and disseminate knowledge, pursue research, contribute to universal truths and maintain the international character of a University. It shall specifically:

- 1) Endeavour to identify with the needs and aspirations of the people where it is located;
- 2) Uphold and develop the ideals of the community within which it is situated and at the same time promote national unity;
- 3) Cherish and preserve the cultural heritage of the society; and

List of Members of Annual Report Drafting Committee

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The Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto (UDUS) which, until the change of name in 1988, was known as the University of Sokoto, was one of the four universities established by the Federal Military Government of Nigeria in 1975. At that time, three University Colleges were also established; which later became full-fledged universities. These seven Universities became variously and popularly known as "the Seven Sisters" or "the Second Generation Universities". They are: the University of Sokoto (renamed in 1988 as Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto); the University of Maiduguri; the University of Port Harcourt; Bayero University, Kano; University of Calabar; University of Jos; and University of Ilorin.

Soon after the appointment, in 1975, of the University's first Vice Chancellor, he began, in earnest, to plan for the realization of the objectives, mission, academic policies, programmes and curricula of the Institution. A meeting was held between the University and the host community, together with the National Universities Commission (NUC) and the Academic Planning Group with a view to identifying those elements that were to make the University the most relevant to the needs of its environment. Memoranda were received from renowned scholars from within and outside Sokoto. Among the prominent people who submitted memoranda and participated in the discussions was Alhaji Shehu Usman Aliyu Shagari (who later became the first Executive President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria). In his memorandum, he pleaded for the relevance of the University to the culture and aspirations of the community in which it was to be sited. The University eventually received its enabling law from the Federal Government in 1979, having operated for the first three years under a Provisional Council.

The University is unique in the sense that of all the Second Generation Universities, it is the only one that started from scratch. In fact, by the time the pioneer Vice Chancellor, Prof Shehu Ahmad Said Galadanci was appointed, the "University" was no more than a concept or an idea. This was in contrast to the other six "Sisters" which had been colleges of older Universities or had inherited physical structures from where they could start to operate. The task before the initial managers of the University, therefore, was not only challenging but daunting. Fortunately, with the good rapport established by the then Vice Chancellor with the State Government, the former secretariat complex of the then Sokoto State was placed at his disposal to serve as the Temporary Site of the University. With the provision of some additional facilities, the site was ready for the enrolment of its first set of students.

Thus, in October 1977, the first batch of 93 students were admitted to read various undergraduate courses in Arts and Sciences. It is worthy to note that a substantial number of those pioneer undergraduates were able to progress in their studies without hitches and were conferred with their bachelors' degrees during the first convocation ceremony of the University held on 22nd October, 1980. In that year, 72 graduands were conferred with bachelor's degrees. Since those early days, the University has continued to sustain this academic tempo as it recorded significant increase in the



number of graduands in the subsequent convocation ceremonies. This was evident in the last (35th 36th & 37th) Joint Convocation Ceremony held from Friday 12th to Saturday 13th, April, 2019, as 12,282 graduands were conferred with various Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates, out of which 135 received Doctorate Degrees, 770 Masters Degrees, 96 Post-Graduate Diplomas, 10,994 Bachelor's Degrees and 287 Diploma's and Certificates.

Development of Faculties, Schools, Centres and Programmes

The University at inception started with only 4 Faculties: Arts and Islamic Studies, Social Sciences, Education and Extension Services and Science. By 1985, the number of Faculties increased to eight with the establishment of College of Health Sciences (CHS), Faculties of Law, Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine. The Postgraduate School was also established in 1983. Faculties of Management Sciences and Pharmaceutical Sciences were established in 2002 and 2003 respectively, as well as School of Medical Laboratory Science in 2002. Three Faculties were later established in the CHS, viz: Faculties of Clinical Science and Basic Medical Science, established in 2014; and Faculties of Basic Clinical Science and Allied Health Sciences were established in 2017 and 2022 respectively. Faculty of Engineering and Environmental Design was established in 2016. The Faculty of Science was split into Faculties of Chemical and Life Sciences and Physical and Computing Sciences in 2022. In the same vein, the Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies was also split into Faculties of Arts and Arabic and Islamic Studies.

Currently, the University has a total of 17 Faculties, a Postgraduate School, a School of Medical Laboratory Science, Nine (9) Research Centres and a number of other academic support units.

The University staff strength is put at over three thousand (3,000), while students' enrolment has continued to increase over the years from 200 at inception to about 25,000 as at 2023. Interestingly, the University's student enrolment is cosmopolitan in nature with every state of the federation (including FCT) being represented at all levels. There are also a number of foreign students.

The University presently runs 80 undergraduate programmes in various fields of human endeavour i.e. Arts, Humanities, Pure and Applied Sciences. Similarly, the University runs postgraduate programmes leading to the award of doctor of philosophy (PhD), Masters degrees and postgraduate diplomas, virtually all the academic departments.

The University Campuses

The University generally consists of three campuses that are geographically separated: the main campus, the City Campus and the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Teaching Hospital (UDUTH). The two campuses, aside from the Main Campus, are located within the Sokoto metropolis.



The Main Campus houses the Central Administration Complex, Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies, and Faculty of Education and Extension Services, Law, Management Sciences, Social Sciences, Engineering and Environmental Design, Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine (Pre-Clinical Sciences), Chemical and Life Sciences, Physical and Computing Sciences, Centre for Advanced Science Research and Analytical Services (CASRAS), Centre for Peace Studies (CPS), and LADAN Centre.

The City Campus houses Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (Clinical Sciences), Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH), Centre for Islamic Studies, and Centre for Hausa Studies (Cibiyar Nazarin Hausa). The UDUTH Campus houses all programmes and Faculties under the College of Health Sciences, School of Medical Laboratory Sciences, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Institute of Urology and Nephrology; and Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRET).

Complexes in the University

To ease the administration in the University, the various organs of the University are structured into complexes. In the Usmanu Danfodiyo University therefore, complex administrative structures are one of the core organs of University system and in view of the relocation of some Faculties to new sites and the expansion of the University in recent years, the need to reorganize the hitherto complexes becomes pertinent.

The Vice Chancellor in 2022 thus, realized the need to reorganize the Complexes for more administrative convenience. The purpose was to make them more efficient, effective and capable of addressing the ever-increasing administrative and management demands. The decision was also aimed at ensuring a smooth running of the University.

The complexes were reorganised and consolidated and made part and parcel of the University administration in 2023 from the former four (4) complexes to seven (7) as follows:

- i. City Campus Complex (CCC): Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (Clinical Sciences), Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH), C entre for Islamic Studies and Centre for Hausa Studies (Cibiyar Nazarin Hausa).
- ii. Teaching Hospital Complex (THC): College of Health Sciences, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Institute of Urology and Nephrology; and Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRET).
- iii. Arts and Education Complex (AEC): Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies, and Faculty of Education and Extension Services.
- iv. Humanities and Law Complex (HLC): Faculty of Law, Faculty of Management Sciences, Faculty of Social Sciences, Centre for Peace Studies and LADAN Centre.
- v. Engineering and Agrovet Complex (EAC): Faculty of Engineering and Environmental Design, Faculty of Agriculture and Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (Pre-Clinical Sciences).



- vi. Science Complex (SCC): Faculty of Science, Centre for Advanced Science Research and Analytical Services (CASRAS) and Teaching Laboratories (TL).
- vii. Central Administration Complex: Office of the Vice-Chancellor, Registry Department, Bursary Department, Directorate of Examination and Registration, Department of Physical Planning and Development, Department of Estate and Municipal Services, Department of Health Services, Students Affairs Division, Division of General Studies, Directorate of Academic Planning, Directorate of Strategic Planning and General Services, Directorate of Procurement, Directorate of Investment, Internal Audit Unit, Security Division, Public Relations Unit, University Lodges Unit, Management Information System (MIS) Unit, Postgraduate School and Research, Innovation & Development Office, etc.

Implementation of Directorate System in Registry and BursaryDepartments, and Upgrade of Four other Non-teaching Units

In line with the evolving needs and growth of the University, the Management in 2023 endorsed the establishment of a directorate system within the Registry and Bursary Departments as follows:

Registry Department

- i. Directorate of Human Resource
- ii. Directorate of Academic Affairs
- iii. Directorate of General Administration

Bursary Department

- i. Directorate of Treasury and Finance
- ii. Directorate of Budget Control and Assets Management

Similarly, four other non-teaching units/divisions under the Vice Chancellor's office - Internal Audit, Management Information System, Public Relations, and Security Division were elevated to directorates. Furthermore, the former Management Information System unit was now to operate as Directorate of Information and Communication Technology (ICT). The implementation of the directorate system is anticipated to enhance more efficiency and effectiveness in the general administration of the University.

Establishment of Fire Service Unit

The Usmanu Danfodiyo University inaugurated a dedicated Fire Service Unit in 2023 and began to operates independently under the direct oversight of the Vice Chancellor's office. This initiative was preceded by the procurement of a fire-fighting truck in 2022, as part of the University's fire fighting preparedness. Hitherto, the Unit was operating under the Security Division and has undergone restructuring. Professor M. A. Gada was appointed as the pioneer Sole Administrator of the Unit. In addition, the University ensured the redeployment of the fire service personnel and proficient drivers to the newly established Unit.



To ensure a smooth take-off of the Unit, the University collaborated with the Sokoto State Fire Service Department for temporary deployment of seven experienced fire fighting personnel and the much needed training of fire service staff. More so, staff exchange programmes was initiated. This was in addition to other hands-on training workshops organized by the University.

Establishment of Directorate of Affiliate and Part-Time Programmes (DAP-P)

In 2023 the University established the Directorate of Affiliate and Part-time Programmes (DAP-P) as an independent and financially self-sustaining Unit. This Directorate assumes oversight functions of all Part-time and affiliation programmes offered by the University.

A pioneer Director was appointed to spearhead the Directorate. A robust operational structure, including a deputy director, two coordinators for part-time and affiliated programmes each, an administrative secretary, an examinations officer, and an accountant have formally been approved.

The strategic establishment was designed to streamline the management processes and ensure optimal efficiency in the delivery of affiliate and part-time programmes thereby contributing to the overall academic excellence of the University.

Establishment of UDUS Microfinance Bank

The Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, in collaboration with University-Based Cooperative societies successfully established a Microfinance Bank -UDUS Microfinance Bank. The Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) had already issued operational license to the Bank. The Bank is expected to commence operations in 2024 after fulfilment of the necessary regulatory requirements.

This development holds several advantages, including enhanced financial accessibility for members of the University community, enhanced Internally Generated Revenue of the University, fostering economic empowerment through targeted financial services. Additionally, the Microfinance Bank will promote financial inclusivity, stimulating economic growth within the university ecosystem while adhering to regulatory standards set by the CBN.

Formation of Consortium of Universities in Katsina, Kebbi Sokoto and Zamfara State

The challenges facing university system are gradually reaching crisis proportion, and the need to tackle this crisis head-on can not be overemphasized. It is against this background, and considering the need to inject remarkable improvements in the system, through coordinated sharing of resources (both human and material, especially using ICT) that the Vice Chancellor, Prof. L. S. Bilbis came up with an idea of forming a consortium of universities in the four (4) neighbouring (Northwest geopolitical) states of Sokoto, Katsina, Kebbi and Zamfara.



To that end, a meeting was convened on Wednesday, 25 th October, 2023 for Vice Chancellors and Directors of ICT of universities in the four states. At the end of the meeting, a Consortium was formed and has successfully taken off.




Figure 1: Staff Distribution by Geopolitical Zones

Recruitment: The recruitment exercise in the University was last conducted in 2018/2019. Despite the need, the University could not undertake any recruitment to fill existing vacancies for the fact that an embargo was placed on recruitment by the Federal Government (FGN). However, with the lifting of the embargo via the decision of the Federal Executive Council at its EC (2023) 23rd Meeting held on Wednesday, 13th December, 2023, the University has begun preparations for the exercise as it has placed Internal and External advertisements in two national dailies for filling vacancies in six (6) departments that are identified to have pressing and immediate need for staff.

During the period under review, the University was constrained to , fill some vacancies by employing the services of experienced/retired hands on contract appointments. Other temporary appointments, such as visiting and sabbatical, locum and adjourn/part time, were also filled, all as interim measures aimed at mitigating the impact of inadequate manpower across departments vis-a-vis the continuous expansion of the University. 


Figure 2: Type of Temporary Appointment

Disengagement: During the period under review, the University recorded seventy seven (77) exits. This number constitutes 2.47 % of the staff strength. The exits were in form of retirement, resignation/withdrawal, death, and transfer of service. This created a huge vacuum, so alarming as every section of the University was being faced with serious challenge of under-staffing. A summary of exits for the year 2023 is provided in the table below.

Promotion: The University has been undertaking promotion exercises to advance deserving staff to their new ranks every year. Year 2023 is not an exception, in spite of the industrial action by staff based unions experienced in 2022, this policy has been maintained as a way of encouraging and rewarding deserving staff. As at May, 2023, the promotion exercise was fully concluded and letters of promotion were issued to over four hundred affected staff while promotions for Professors and Readers are still being processed. The table below depicts breakdown of all promotions for 2023 across ranks. As at the time of this report, the promotions to the professorial cadre was not concluded because of the dissolution of the University Councils by the Federal Government.

Academic Staff Traning And Development From January, 2023 To December, 2023

From January 2023 to date, the University has sponsored a total of twenty one (21) academic staff for various programmes which include; seventeen (17) PhD, two (2) Bench work and two (2) Postdoc under the TETfund Academic Staff Training and Development (AST&D) to the tune of one hundred and forty four million, four hundred and thirty nine thousand, five hundred and eighty four Naira and seventy seven Kobo only (N144,439,584.77). One hundred and eight (108) academic and non-academic staff were sponsored for conference attendance under TETfund, costing the sum of forty two million, twenty four thousand, and one Naira only (N42,024,001.00). The TETFund Centre of Excellence in Urology and Nephrology also undertakes short term specialised trainings for staff of the Centre and other stakeholders within and outside the country.

2022/2023 Academic Calendar

Following the reopening of the University after the suspension of the nationwide strike embarked upon by the university-based Unions, the University Senate, at its 351st (Special) Meeting held on Wednesday, 15th March, 2023 approved the revised 2022/2023 academic session calendar. The session commenced on Monday, 3rd April, 2023 and ended on 30th December, 2023.

Admission, Registration and Matriculation of New Students

The Senate at its 350th meeting noted that there were two batches of prospective candidates for admission against 2021/2022 and 2022/2023 exercise. The scenario was occasioned by the inability to conduct the 2021/2022 exercise on account of the eight-month ASUU strike action in the year 2022. To that end, Senate granted the two sessions to be subsumed into the 2022/2023 academic session. Consequently, a total number of five thousand nine hundred and fifty nine (5959) candidates were offered admissions into various undergraduate programmes. A two-week time frame was allocated for the new students to get registered. Directorate of Examinations and Registration liaised with relevant stakeholders in coordinating and monitoring of the exercise to its logical conclusion.



In line with existing provision of the University Law, the new students were sworn-in at a colourful matriculation ceremony held on 15th July, 2023.



Profile

The Faculty of Agriculture started a four-year integrated B.Sc. (Honours) Agriculture degree programme for direct entry students with 'A' level or equivalent qualifications in 1980/81 session with 13 students. The programme was based on a "course unit's system". The third year of the programme was devoted to on-farm practical training. In 1985/86 academic session, the programme was reviewed to allow for the admission of students with 'O' level who would then graduate after five years. Since then, the practical training has shifted to the fourth year. From 1990 to date, the programme has been modified to a professional one named B. Agriculture. The programme curriculum were revised in 1989 and in 2013 to conform to the National Universities Commission (NUC) Approved Minimum Academic Standards. The seven constituent Departments of the Faculty are those of Agricultural Extension and Rural Development, Agricultural Economics, Animal Science, Crop Science, Fisheries and Aquaculture, Forestry and Environment and Soil Science and Agricultural Engineering. The Faculty offers three undergraduate programmes namely B. Agriculture, B. Fisheries, and B. Forestry.

Vision of the Faculty

The vision of the Faculty/programme is to train students that are adequately equipped with the comprehensive theoretical knowledge and practical skills required for engaging in productive and economic agricultural, forestry and production.

Mission of the Faculty

The programme is designed to produce graduates equipped with sufficient theoretical knowledge and skills in the cognate areas of agriculture that will make positive contributions to the national developmental goals in agriculture.

The curriculum is structured to provide functional broad-based training in animal, crop and soil sciences as well as social aspects of the economics and extension. The



programme focuses on knowledge acquisition through lectures, field work, laboratory practicals and industrial work experience. The programme intends to produce proactive graduates that will excel in the fast changing socio-economic and technological climate of the modern world providing opportunities for self-employment and increased revenue generation through innovative agricultural production.

It offers different courses at undergraduate and post-graduate levels (PGDCS, MSc, M.Phil. & PhD). The Bachelor of Agriculture (B. Agriculture, Crop/Soil Option Option) programme is designed to provide a broad educational training in agriculture. The five-year degree programme encompasses Agricultural Economics, Agricultural Extension and Rural Development, Animal Science, Crop Science, Soil Science and Agricultural Engineering as integral parts of a composite undergraduate curriculum in general agriculture. The aim is to enable students appreciate and tackle the diverse and multiple constraints to food production.

The programme recognizes the need to produce competent personnel to man the agriculture sector of the economy, thus, a one year programme is introduced at four hundred level (400), exclusively for laboratory and field practicals in all the courses, which include practical training in the University's farm, as well as in commercial farms and agro-industrial enterprises within and outside the catchment area of the institution. The Department also provides high quality postgraduate research (both fundamental and applied) with modern laboratory facilities, screen houses and field structure. The



Department also implements need-based and demand-driven research in field crop production for improving productivity and thus helping the nation to ensure food security.

The major areas of teaching and research of the Department are Crop Production, Crop Anatomy and Physiology, Crop Genetics and Breeding, Weed Science, Entomology, Plant Pathology, Horticulture and Irrigation Agronomy, The Department has well-equipped laboratories for teaching and research. In addition, the Department boasts of screen houses and four farms namely: Botanical Garden, Dry land, Lowland (*Fadama*) and Propagation orchard as components of field research for undergraduate and post-graduate studies. The Department also hosted the 49th Weed Science Society of Nigeria 2023 Conference.

The main thrusts of the programmes are:

- Provision of basic knowledge needed for the analysis and understanding of the physical, climatic and socio-economic environments of food production systems and to proffer appropriate solutions to the problems.

The Department of Animal Science is one out of five Departments that made up the present Faculty of Agriculture. The faculty of Agriculture started a four-year integrated B.Sc. (Honours) degree programme for direct entry students with A level or equivalent



qualifications in 1980/81 session. The programme was based on a course unit system. The third year of the programme was devoted to on-farm practical training.

In 1985/86 session, the programme was reviewed to allow for the admission of students into 100 level who would then graduate after 5 years. Since then, the practical training has shifted to the fourth year. From 1990 to date, the programme has been modified to a professional one named B. Agriculture.

Profile

The Department of Agricultural Economics began as a full-fledged Department following the splitting of the erstwhile Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension in 2011/2012 session. The Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension was one of the pioneer departments of the Faculty of Agriculture which took off in 1980/81 academic sessions, respectively. The departments in the Faculty jointly award a composite degree in Agriculture. Considering the need for specialization of student right from the first degree, the University Senate approved the splitting of the former department of Agricultural Economics and Extension into two separate departments in 2011/2012 session, that is, the Agric Economics and Agric Extension and Rural Development Departments.

Apart from the undergraduate B. Agric programme with specialisation in Agricultural Economics, the department hosts the Postgraduate Diploma Programme in Agricultural Economics and Extension (PGDAEE), a preparatory and transitional diploma for Higher National Diploma (HND) holders or University graduates who are either deficient or areswitching from other relevant disciplines for MSc Programme in either Agricultural Economics or Agricultural Extension. The Department also offers Postgraduate studies leading to the award of degrees (MPhil, MSc and PhD) in Agricultural Economics

The Department of Agricultural Economics being a service oriented Department has been very active in a number of studies/surveys for E.U and World Bank through Fadama III, Fadama III AF, Fadama NG-CARES, IFAD/CASP and Transforming Irrigation Management in Nigeria (TRIMING) projects. Experts in the Department are



actively engaged in studies, advisory and consultancy services for various development projects and programmes. The Department had collaboration with Africa Rice through the TRIMING Programme. Department of Agricultural Extension and Rural Development

Profile

The Department of Agricultural Extension and Rural Development began operating in 2011/2012 academic session, following the bifurcation of the former Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension. The Department of Agricultural Economics and Extension was one of the pioneer Departments of the Faculty of Agriculture which came into existence by the approval of the University Senate. The Department took off in 1979 and 1980/81 academic session, respectively.

At undergraduate level, the Department offers joint Bachelor of Agriculture degree (Agricultural Extension and Rural Development) with Agricultural Economics, Animal Science, Crop Science, and Soil Science and Agricultural Engineering Departments. It also houses the Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural Extension and Community Development which admits mid-career extension workers (Higher National Diploma graduates) to 300 level. At higher level, PGD Agricultural Economics and Extension (jointly with the Department of Agricultural Economics), Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy in Agricultural Extension programmes are offered by the Department.



Currently, the Department has collaboration with Sassakawa Africa Fund for Extension Education (SAFE) based on the August 19, 2014 MoU signed by the University with SAFE to strengthen and upgrade the professional and scientific skills of mid-career extension professionals. The MoU gave birth to the earlier mentioned Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural Extension and Community Development.

Experts in the Department are actively engaged in various studies and consultancy services to the National Fadama Development Project, International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), Transforming Irrigation Management in Nigeria (TRIMING) Project, etc. However, the Department is open for more collaborations and studies/surveys in the areas of agricultural extension and development of rural areas; especially technology transfer, farmer and youth training, rural livelihood, climate change, sustainable rural areas, gender and development, and adoption of innovation.

Profile

The Department was created in August, 2014, following the split of the Department of Forestry and Fisheries into the Department of Forestry and Environment and the Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture. The two Departments existed as two Units from August 2008 to July 2014.

The Department of Forestry and Fisheries was established alongside four other Departments (Agricultural Economics and Extension, Animal Science, Crop Science, and Soil and Agricultural Engineering) at the 15th meeting of the University Senate held on 27th June and 5th July, 1979 respectively. The Faculty of Agriculture and the five Departments commenced activities during 1980/81 academic session.

Considering the importance of Fisheries Sciences to food production in Nigeria and the catchment area of the University in particular, and in consonance with the orientation of training of high-level manpower in the different areas of agriculture, the University and the Senate approved the undergraduate programme in Bachelor of Fisheries (B. Fisheries) in April, 1996. This degree programme commenced in 1999/2000 academic session. The programme is designed to produce high level manpower for management, development and exploitation of freshwater and marine resources, including aquaculture for sustainable advancement of the fisheries sub-sector of the economy. It is structured to inculcate sound theoretical and practical knowledge on the complexities, interactions and dynamics of fisheries system, their management strategies, including exchange of information through modern communication technologies. The curriculum is designed for knowledge acquisition through lectures, field and laboratory practical and industrial works experience. The logic and rationale of the programme has the potentials for selfreliance, job creation, creativity, morality and leadership skills. Graduates should possess the capacity in pursuing career opportunities in public fisheries establishments, academic, research and relevant corporate enterprises.



The Department has a teaching and research farm made up of five units (Fish nursery and grow out unit, hatchery unit, and fish feed mill unit. Recently the Department got approval of the university management for the construction of a floating fish feed mill which has now attained 95% completion, Artisanal Fisheries & Fishing Gear Technology Unit and Fish Processing Unit) where students train via hands-on practicals to complement class activities. The Department shares laboratory with the Department of Forestry and Environment as well as visit other related laboratories in the Faculties of Agriculture, Sciences and Veterinary Medicine and the University central laboratories to make use of relevant equipment as they relate to the study at hand.

Over the years, the Department has been carrying out community services in the areas of fish production in the catchment states of Sokoto, Zamfara, Kebbi and Katsina to boost productivity towards attaining high nutrition intake and improved livelihood.

Collaboration and linkages

There are ongoing collaborations on Farm Adaptive Research Project with the University of Ibadan, Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), and University of Georgia USA, titled: Aquaculture and rural communities: Farm diversification strategies through integrated agriculture-aquaculture systems and nutrition sensitive value chains for better nutrition outcomes in Kebbi and Ebonyi States Nigeria.

The Department has just won a research grant on a breeding project titled "Development of an induced breeding protocol for the Giraffe Catfish, towards seed production and Aquaculture diversification in Nigeria" from the National Agency for Science Engineering Infrastructure NASENI-PICTT in collaboration with Usmaniyya General Consultants Ltd.

Department of Forestry and Environment

Profile

The University began training in Agriculture during 1980/1981 session with Forestry and Fisheries as integral parts of the programme. The incorporation of both Forestry and Fisheries into Agricultural curriculum makes the programme a unique one compared to that of other universities that run separate degree programmes for Forestry and Fisheries. However, the NUC introduced Approved Minimum Standards for Agriculture, Forestry, Fisheries and Home Economics in 1989. The curriculum in general and Agriculture in particular was adopted in the University during the 1989/1990 session, but only two courses (one each in the Forestry and Fisheries) were introduced at 300 level. The 1993/1994 session complete the earlier agriculture programme of the university. Considering the importance of Forestry and Fisheries sciences to food production, especially in the northern part of Nigeria and the catchment areas of the University in particular, and in line with the orientation of training of high level manpower in the different areas of agricultural resources and manpower development over a decade-and-half, the undergraduate programmes in Bachelor of Forestry (B. Forestry) and Bachelor of Fisheries (B. Fisheries) was approved by the Senate in April, 1996. These two degree programmes commenced in 2000/2001 academic session. The last quarter of 2014 saw the bifurcation of the Department of Forestry and Fisheries into two independent departments namely, the Forestry and Environment as well as the Fisheries and Aquaculture Departments in August 2014. The Department is currently running a B. Forestry and Postgraduate programmes that include PhD Forestry, M.Sc. Forest Biology and Silviculture and PGD Forestry.

As at December 2023, there were nine (09) academic staff in the Department (2 Professors, 2 Readers, 1 Senior Lecturer, and 4 Lecturer I), three (3) laboratory staff and three (3) non-teaching office staff.

Profile

The Faculty of Arts was created in 2022 with Professor Shehu Sidi Ibrahim as the pioneer Dean. The creation follows from the splitting of the former Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies which was created in 1976 after the official establishment of the University of Sokoto (now Usmanu Danfodiyo University) in 1975. The former Faculty was one of the pioneer faculties with which the University started its academic activities. In order to play its role in providing an encouraging atmosphere for learning and character building for the younger minds, five departments were housed in the Faculty; which study and conduct a wide range of researches in the fields of the Arts and Islamic Sciences. The Departments are Arabic, History, Islamic Studies, Modern European Languages and Linguistics, and Nigerian Languages. The Department was created in 2022 with Dr Abubakar Atiku Alkali as the pioneer Head of Department (HOD). Prior to its creation, the Department was known as the



English Unit under the former Department of Modern European Languages and Linguistics which was established in 1979 and started its academic programmes during the 1979/80 academic session with Prof C. T. Probyn as the pioneer Head. The Department of Modern European Languages and Linguistics itself was established as the Department of Modern European Languages prior to the introduction of the BA Linguistics programme in 2001. The BA English programme was the oldest in the former Department, being run alongside BA French even though the French Unit of the Department was not created until 1987.

At present, the Department runs two (2) fully accredited undergraduate degree programmes. These are BA (Hons) English Language and BA (Hons) Literature in In addition, the Department offers postgraduate degree programmes covering both areas taught at the undergraduate level (i.e. MA, MPhil and Ph.D. in English Language and Literature in English).

The Department boasts of a fully functional Language Laboratory with state-of-the-art facilities suitable for the teaching of phonetics, phonology and related courses. In addition, the Department houses a spacious resource room with an appreciable collection of up-to-date reference materials to support the immediate needs of its students.

Profile

Established in 1979 as a French degree Programme of the Department of Modern European Languages. French is one of the First Academic Programmes of the University of Sokoto, now Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto. Although, the French Programme started and always records a very small number of students of BA French, it has been and is still a Feeder Programme especially for the students of BA English Language, BA Literature in English and BA Linguistics for Borrowed Courses. However, the B. A. French Programme has been elevated to the level of French Unit of the Department of Modern European Languages in the year 1987.

In addition to the BA French Language, the French Unit has been running Certificate and Diploma courses in French in conjunction with UDUCONS. Some of the beneficiaries of these programmes have enrolled for BA French and have graduated successfully. Some other beneficiaries of the programmes were enabled to go on and study in Foreign Francophone Countries.

Profile

The Department of Linguistics of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto was created in May, 2022 following the splitting of the Department of Modern European Languages and Linguistics into three Departments: English and Literary Studies Department, Linguistics Department and French Department as approved for the University, by the National Universities Commission.

Before the split and creation of the Linguistics Department, the B. A. Linguistics Programme was first instituted in 2001 by the then newly established Linguistics Unit which was one of the 3 Units that formed the defunct Department of Modern European Languages and Linguistics. The Linguistics unit started its academic programmes during the 2001/2002 academic session. Since inception, it has had four Heads of Unit. They are Prof. Dahiru Muhammad Argungu, Prof. Malami Buba, Prof. Abubakar Muhammad and Prof. Muhammad Ango Aliero. At inception, Dr Umar Ahmed became the pioneer Head of Department of Linguistics alongside a host of highly qualified academic and non-academic staff.

In addition to B. A. Linguistics programme, the former Linguistics Unit, (now a full pledged Department) offers MA, MPhil. and Ph.D. degree programmes in diverse



fields of Linguistics. From 2013 to 2023, the Unit has so far awarded twenty four (24) MA; and seven (7) PhD Degrees in Linguistics; and presently, six PhD; seven MPhil. and over 40 MA Students are pursuing their Post-graduate Degree programmes in Linguistics in the Department.

Profile

The Department was established in 1976 with the aim of introducing the students to full knowledge of Hausa language, literature and culture. Initially, the The Department was called the 'Department of Hausa' but was and later changed to the Department of Nigerian Languages. The Department stated with four visiting lecturers. In 1978, the late A'isha Ahmed was employed as Assistant Lecturer and as the first permanent staff and Acting Head of Department. In the same vein, three National Youth Corp members were posted to the Department. These were appointed as permanent staff in 1979. Since then, many more staff have been employed while others promoted to various ranks.

The Department has three academic programmes: B. A. Degree in Hausa, M. A. and PhD Degrees. The Ph. D programmes was introduced in 1983 while the M. A. Degree was mounted in 1988. The Department has graduated dozens of MAs, and PhDs in the three designated areas of Language, Literature and Culture. The B. A. Hausa Programme gained full accreditation in 2019 exercise. The Faculty of Arabic and Islamic Studies was established in 2021 after the official splitting of the former Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies into two independent faculties, that is the Faculty of Arabic and Islamic Studies and Faculty of Arts, following the Senate approval. This became effective during the tenure of Prof. L.S. Bilbis, as the Vice Chancellor of the University, and as approved by National Universities Commission.

In order to play its role in providing an encouraging atmosphere for learning and character building for the younger minds, four academic departments were housed in the Faculty which teach and conduct a wide range of researches in the fields of the Arabic and Islamic Sciences. The Departments are: Arabic Studies, Arabic Literary Studies, Islamic Studies and Department of Shari'ah Studies. 

Profile

The Department of Islamic Studies, which is one of the departments that constitute the Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies, was established in the 1976/77 academic session. A couple of fulltime lecturers – Dr. A. A. Gwandu and Dr. M.I.H.I. Surty and some p art-time lecturers were the pioneer teaching staff of the Department. Presently, the Department is staffed with Professors, Senior Lecturers and others.

In the 1977/78 academic session, when the first set of students were admitted, a total of 27 students were registered and of this number 13 were majored in Islamic Studies, while the remaining offered it as a minor subject. From this modest figure, the annual student intake has increased phenomenally, reaching more than two hundred students at the turn of the millennium. Currently, the Department has about twenty-three members of academic staff and five hundred and twenty-five (525) students majoring in Islamic Studies.



The qualities of our products are adjudged to be high. Several institutions of higher learning have employed our graduates in various capacities, many of them as lecturers or employed to fill-in administrative positions. Many graduates of the Department could also be found in the Military, Para-military, Judiciary and Foreign Services. The Department itself has identified the best of its graduating students and retained them to join the pool of its academic staff. Our aggressive human resource development drive has paid off not only in terms of helping to develop and maintain high quality, but also to ensure that we have an excellent pool of teaching staff specializing in a wide range of areas of specialization in Islamic Studies.

Philosophy and Objectives of the Programme

The programme is designed to pursue the development of human beings through the inculcation of Islamic values, norms and principles, without which the goal of ideological, moral, intellectual and economic development of individuals may not be achieved. The curriculum is structured to produce qualified intellectuals, professionals and scholars by integrating the articles of faith (*Iman*), qualities of knowledge, (*Ilm*) and good character (*Akhlaq*) to serve as ingredients of comprehensive, balanced and sustainable development of the individual. It focuses on developing practical solutions through research on contemporary problems of Nigerian society in particular and the Muslim world in general.

- 5. train students that would adequately serve the staffing needs of institutions, schools, judiciary and other relevant establishments
- 6. prepare students for higher Degrees in Islamic studies and other related disciplines

Profile

The Department of Islamic Studies, through the then Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies applied to the University for permission to undertake Bachelors of Arts Degree programmes in *Shari'ah*, Qur'an and *Hadith* Studies. At the 352nd meeting of Senate held on Thursday, 27th April, 2023, the Senate considered the report of the Committee on Establishment of B.A. *Shari'ah* and approved it to be under the new Faculty of Arabic and Islamic Studies. Meanwhile, the University, in line with the advice of the National Universities Commission (NUC) in a letter reference NUC/AP/F12/VOL.1/56, dated 17th March, 2021 adopted instead the 'Department of *Shari'ah* Studies' which has all the components of Qur'an and *Hadith* Studies'. It also approved the Department of *Shari'ah* Studies on the same day. On 13th September, 2023, Dr Muntaka Yahaya Aminu was appointed as the pioneer Acting Head of the Department.

The National Universities Commission conducted a resource verification exercise for the Department to commence B.A. *Shari'ah*, B.A. Qur'anic Studies and B.A *Hadith* Studies on 3rd October, 2023. *Alhamdulillah*, the approval for the commencement of the programmes was communicated to the University on the 22nd December, 2023, and the programmes schedule to commence during the 2023/2024 academic session.

Philosophy and Objectives of the Programmes

The Shari'ah, to the Muslims, is identical with Islam. Shari'ah and Din have been used interchangeably by Muslim scholars. It correlates to Din as it is a way of belief and practices with respect to Muslims' life. The study of Shari'ah is Allah's mandate given to all Muslims who should abide by the teachings of Islam in their entire life. The programme is designed to pursue the understanding and development of Shari'ah, Islamic Jurisprudence and principles of Islamic Jurisprudence as mechanisms for deduction and interpretation of the Islamic legal system as a meaningful way of life of the Muslim Ummah. The programme seeks to acquaint students with the knowledge of Shari'ah and its application in Nigeria. The curriculum is structured to produce qualified intellectuals, professionals and personnel of Shari'ah courts capable of



providing practical solutions to the contemporary problems in Nigeria and the world in general.

Objectives

The objectives of the programme are to:

- a- train students to become Judicial personnel and acquaint them with broad knowledge of Islamic Shari'ah;
- b- prepare students to apply their knowledge of Islamic Jurisprudence, Qur'an and Hadith to analyze and proffer solutions to the problems of contemporary Muslim communities in Nigeria;
- c- make students understand the place of *Shari'ah* in the context of other Nigerian legal systems;
- d- train students that would adequately serve the staffing needs of Colleges of Islamic legal Studies, judiciary and other relevant establishments;
- e- prepare students for higher Islamic Legal Studies and related disciplines.

The programme is designed to pursue the development of human beings through the inculcation of Islamic values, norms and principles, without which the goal of ideological, moral, intellectual and economic development of the individual in society may not be achieved. The programmes seek to make students see the *Qur'an* and *Hadith* of Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W) as the two pillars on which Islam is based. Profile

The CHS was founded in 1980 with Professor Frank Howarth as its first Provost. It became a full fledged College in 2014, when a collegiate system was approved for it by the University Senate. The CHS currently comprises 5 faculties, a school and 2 advanced centres of medical research, and located in the Teaching Hospital Complex of the University.

The CHS has full accreditation for the training of medical doctors (MBBS), medical laboratory scientists (BMLS), nurses (BNSc) and radiographers (BRad) approved by the National Universities Commission (NUC) and the professional regulatory bodies (MDCN, MLSCN, NMCN and RRCN respectively). It also has fledgling programmes in dentistry, optometry, physiotherapy, and nutrition and dietetics.

The College held its maiden CHS Scientific Conference and Maiden Alumni Meeting on 14th and 15th of July 2023. The main theme was "Challenges of Health Sciences education in the 21st Century" with Prof. Hamidu Ahmed, OON as the Keynote Speaker. The Sub-theme was "the role of alumni in the development of institutions" with Prof I.A. Mungadi as the Speaker. Over 44 scientific oral and 18 poster presentations were delivered. One of the invited papers was on building a world class research and development (R & D) ecosystem in Nigeria, which was delivered by Dr MU Imam, the Director of the Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRET).

Department of Nursing Sciences

The Department of Nursing Sciences was established in the year 2012 and admitted the first set of thirty (30) students in 2012/2013 academic session. Currently, the Department has 287 students across all levels. So far the Department graduated four sets of students.

The Department is performing excellently in terms of teaching, research and community service in order to meet its objectives of producing polyvalent nurses who will work in a variety of preventive, curative and rehabilitative nursing care to promote health, prevent diseases and restore health of individuals, families and communities.

Moreover, the Department has recorded excellent performances in the Professional Examination for General Nurses and Professional Examination for Midwives organized by the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria with 100% success in all the



examinations. By December 2023, 80% of all the academic staff obtained PhD degree in Nursing, and the remaining two staff members are currently pursuing PhD degree programme.

The Department, in collaboration with Centre for Open and Distance Education (CODE), commenced BNSc degree programme through Open and Distance Learning Mode to give nurses, working around the region and beyond, the opportunity to further their education. In collaboration with NMCN the Department accepted the adaptation programme for the foreign trained nurses in their preparation for NMCN examination and subsequent registration to practice as Registered Nigerian Nurses.

The University Senate, in 2023 approved the commencement of postgraduate programmes for the Department. Following the resource visitation by the National Universities Commission (NUC), the programmes were approved to commence in 2023/2024 Session.

The *B. Radiography* programme started in 2012/2013 session with the first set of students admitted from the University's matriculation programme. The objective of the



programme is to train competent, confident and compassionate radiographers who will play key roles in healthcare delivery in Nigeria, especially in Northern Nigeria where there is shortage of healthcare workers, particularly radiographers.

Given the existing facilities in the Teaching Hospital and investment in academic staff training, the prospects of the Department in successful growth and development of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in radiography is high. The Department is expected to develop and become a hub of training in the radiation sciences and professions like diagnostic radiography, therapy radiography, nuclear medicine, and medical physics among others.

Department of Physiotherapy

The Bachelor of Physiotherapy Programme was founded in 2020 and enrolled students from the Matriculation School. Currently, the Department has a total number of 97 students. The Bachelor of Physiotherapy was upgraded to a Doctor of Physiotherapy in 2023 by the Senate of the University, to align with it the recently developed Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) of the NUC. The programme duration has therefore been extended to six years, as opposed to the previous five years.

Department of Human Nutrition and Dietetics

The Department of Human Nutrition and Dietetics was established in 2019, following the approval by the Senate of Usmanu Danfodiyo University and subsequent approval by the National Universities Commission after the resource visitation in 2020. The decision to establish the Department was taken at the 332nd meeting of the University Senate held on 25th September, 2019. The creation of the Department was informed by the national need for graduates of Human Nutrition and Dietetics. It was also in response to the need to bridge the serious shortage of nutrition professionals in the immediate environment of North-Western Nigeria in particular and the entire northern region in general.

The Department admitted its first set of students (28 in number) during the 2021/2022 Academic Session to pursue the Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Nutrition and Dietetics. In 2023/2024 Session, the first set will be in 300 Level. The Department has a modest number of academic staff and is headed by Prof. R.A.Umar, with the hope that with the recent lifting of embargo on employment by Nigerian Universities more capable hands will join the teaching force to enable the Department to effectively and efficiently deliver on its mandate of teaching, research and community service.

The Department, integrating knowledge from the physical, molecular, biological and social sciences, pursues human nutrition to improve health of the community, region, country and globally to advance understanding of the contemporary nutrition landscapes. The Department prepares students to join the workforce as followers or leaders in community health, health science, dietetics, advocacy, social behaviour change, programme implementation, surveys and more. Our robust curriculum offers effective, practical and critical thinking-based training (with adequate clinical experience) which opens internship placements and job opportunities to our students.



Our students are highly trained to address opportunities and challenges in the food system at the local, country and international levels.

The Department currently researches into sustainable food systems, food safety, food fortification and development of ready-to-use therapeutic foods using locally available raw materials. Department of Psychiatry

Profile

The Department of Psychiatry was fully established by the Usmanu Danfodiyo University in 2004, prior to its establishment, it was a unit under the Department of Internal Medicine from 1995 with the appointment of Professor Ayodele Obembe as an honorary consultant of the institution's teaching hospital.

The Department is responsible for the training of medical students in the field of Psychology and Behavioral Sciences in their 4th year with a rotation duration of 4 weeks and Clinical Psychiatry in the final year for 6 weeks which comprises classroom lectures, seminar presentation and conferences, introduction and use of psychometric instruments, ward rounds for patients on admission and outpatient clinic. During the UG 6 clinical posting in psychiatry, medical students are taught how to conduct research in psychiatry, development of questionnaire and psychiatry epidemiology.

The students, as part of their training, undergo posting at the Federal Neuropsychiatric Hospital Kware (FNPHK), excursion to Prisons and National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA). Over the years, the Department has developed minimally in terms of facility and manpower. The Department started with one consultant with tenure appointment, Professor of Psychiatry, Ayodele Obembe who recently retired in January 2020. However, the Department now has 2 consultants with tenure appointment; a Professor of Psychiatry and a Senior Lecturer and 3 administrative staff. The Department currently has no clinical psychologist.

Profile

The School of Medical Laboratory Sciences formally took off following the approval by the Senate of the University at its 225th meeting held on Wednesday, 30th July, 2003. The National Universities Commission (NUC) granted the School full accreditation in 2005, while MLSCN accreditation was gotten in 2006. The pioneer students of the School (11 in number) were admitted in 2003 and graduated in 2008. By 2023, the School had graduated about 500 registered Medical Laboratory Scientists in the five departments of Chemical Pathology, Haematology, Histopathology, Immunology and Medical Microbiology.

At its 275th Meeting held on Wednesday, 9th January 2013, the Senate of the University approved the change of status of the School to Faculty of Medical Laboratory Sciences, taking into consideration both NUC and MLSCN stance and provision to granting full accreditation to the School. The nomenclature was however reversed in 2015 pending resource verification by NUC. The necessary documents had been completed and NUC resource visit is being awaited.

The University Senate at its 276th Meeting held on Thursday, 28th February, 2013 approved the commencement of Postgraduate training in the School. The pioneer MSc. Students (27 of them from all the five specialties) were admitted in 2012/13 academic session and since then, about 40 students have graduated from the programme. Also, Doctor of Philosophy programme (PhD), Master of Philosophy (MPhil) and Postgraduate Diploma (PGD) in all the five specialties were approved by the Senate of the University in 2019. NUC resource verification is being awaited.

The University graciously equipped the School with five specialty laboratories, one each for the specialties, magnificent administrative block and two multipurpose laboratories for effective teaching and research in the Profession. Most of the staff have acquired MSc and PhD qualifications while some are currently undergoing postgraduate training.

Profile

The Faculty of Chemical and Life Sciences, formerly called Faculty of Science, was one of the seven foundation Faculties of the University of Sokoto, now Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto. The creation of the Faculty was approved by Senate in its 15th meeting held on 27th June and 5th July, 1975. However, it took off in 1977/78 session, starting classes with four Departments on 20th October 1977 at the temporary site, now called the City Campus. The four original Departments were Biological Sciences (with two Units of Zoology and Botany); Chemistry; Mathematics and Physics. In the second phase of the Faculty development, the Department of Biochemistry (now Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology) was established in 1982. In addition, Applied Chemistry Unit was introduced in 1981/82 Academic Session in the Department of Chemistry (which is now divided into the Department of Pure and Environmental Chemistry & Department of Energy and Applied Chemistry, effective 2022). In 1989 and 1990 Microbiology and Biology Units were established respectively in the Department of Biological Sciences. However, in 2006, Microbiology Unit was upgraded to full-fledged Department. The former Botany unit is now converted to Plant Science Department and the Biology unit is now also a Department, effective 2022. Thus, presently the faculty has seven departments namely, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology; Pure and Environmental Chemistry; Energy and Applied Chemistry; Plant Science; Microbiology; Zoology and Biology.

The Faculty also runs full-time Masters and Doctor of Philosophy degree programmes in diverse fields across all the Departments, as well as Diploma in Laboratory Science Technology, in conjunction with the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Consultancy Services (UDUCONS). Furthermore, the Faculty provides course services to College of Health Sciences, Faculties of Veterinary Medicine, Pharmacy, Engineering and Environmental Design, Physical and Computing Science, Agriculture as well as Education and Extension Services. The programmes in each of the seven departments of the faculty were designed after taking into consideration the



requirements of the NUC approved Minimum Academic Standards for training of Scientists and Technologist, as clearly spelt in the NUC Approved Minimum Academic Standards in Sciences for all Nigerian Universities.

The Department of Biochemistry was established in 1982 to cater for the rising need for Biochemists in the core catchment areas of the University in particular and the country in general. The Department was renamed in 2023 as Department of



Biochemistry and Molecular Biology to further align it with the global best practices and in compliance with International Union of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (IUBMB). The Department is in the Faculty of Chemical and Life Sciences and is responsible for running B.Sc. Honours Degree Programme in Biochemistry, teaching basic Biochemistry courses to students in the College of Health Sciences, School of Medical Laboratory Sciences, Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, and any other Faculty that may require basic knowledge of biochemistry in their training. The Department in collaboration with advanced research centres like; Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRET), Centre for Advanced Science Research and Analytical Services (CASRAS) and Centre for Biotechnology and Plant Tissue Culture (CBAPTC), is involved in advanced researches in biosciences including biomedical sciences.

The Department offered different Postgraduate degrees and diplomas, including: Ph.D., M.Sc. and PGD, and have graduated lots of students at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels, since its establishment.

Profile

The Department of Biological Sciences was one of the four foundation Departments of the Faculty of Science that started operation in October 1977. The Department was composite in nature comprising units running programmes in Botany and Zoology in 1977. In 1989, the programme in Microbiology was added and following the introduction of minimum academic standards (MAC) in Nigerian Universities, the Biology programme started in 1992-93 session.

The B.Sc. Biology programme was introduced in the 1992/1993 session under the Biology Unit. The Unit was upgraded to a full-fledged Department of Biology on 17th March, 2021 by the University Senate and approved by the NUC. The programme provides basic training for the award of B.Sc. Honours in Biology and caters for the needs of B.Sc. Education, B. Agric., MBBS, DVM, Pharmacy, B. Eng. Engineering and BMLS students. Areas such as ecology, behaviour, morphology, taxonomy, physiology, and genetics are explored with a view to train adequate manpower to cater for current needs of the community science education, environmental protection, medical and paramedical sectors and food production.



Philosophy

The programme is designed to produce intellectuals and professionals with advanced knowledge of fundamentals of living organisms coupled with research capabilities to take and solve problems independently. The underlying philosophy of the programme is to produce graduates with a sound knowledge of living things and their adaptations to the environment.

Objectives

The main objectives of the programme are to:

- 1) Provide students with a broad and balanced knowledge and practical skills in the field of Biology.
- 2) Develop ability in students to apply knowledge and skills in solving theoretical and practical problems in Biology.

- 4) Provide foundation to students with knowledge and skills from which they can proceed to further studies in specialized areas of biology or multi-disciplinary areas related to Biology.

- 6) To develop enthusiastic sense among students of Biology and appreciate them on its application in different contexts of learning and research.

Profile

The Department of Energy and Applied Chemistry has its origins in the Department of Chemistry which was one of the pioneer departments established in 1977 following the creation of the University of Sokoto (now Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto) in 1975. The department was initially awarding B.Sc. Chemistry until during the 1981/1982 academic session when B.Sc. Applied Chemistry was introduced. In 1995, the Department was renamed "Department of Pure and Applied Chemistry", and subsequently, two units (Pure Chemistry Unit and Applied Chemistry Unit), were created under the Department, each headed by a Head of Unit.

The creation of the Department of Energy and Applied Chemistry was as a result of the decision of the University Senate in 2021 to upgrade all academic units under various departments into full-fledged departments. Consequently, the Applied Chemistry Unit was upgraded into the Department of Energy and Applied Chemistry under the newly created Faculty of Chemical and Life Sciences. Operationally, however, the department took effect in May 2022 when Dr. Misbahu Ladan Mohammed was appointed as the pioneer Head of the Department.

The Department awards B.Sc. Applied Chemistry in addition to postgraduate programmes leading to the award of M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees in Industrial Chemistry, Petroleum Chemistry, and Renewable Energy. It also offers M.Phil. degrees in Petroleum Chemistry and Renewable Energy.

The Department is largely housed in the Petroleum Technology Development Fund (PTDF) Upgrade Building. PTDF also sponsors a Professorial Chair in Petroleum Chemistry under the Department with Professor A. B. Muhammad as the current Chair



Occupant. Since its inception in 2003, the Chair embarked on staff development in petroleum studies as a prelude to the commencement of B.Sc. Petroleum Chemistry programme. Now the staff threshold for the take-off of the programme is achieved and it is expected to commence as soon as approved by the University Senate.

To provide students with the necessary education, training, and mentorship to enable them to work professionally in the chemical and energy sectors to advance the quality of life on a green planet.

Profile

The Microbiology Department offers a 4-year degree programme leading to a B.Sc. Honours Degree in Microbiology. The B.Sc. Microbiology programme commenced as a unit under the Department of Biological Sciences during the 1988/89 academic session with a total of 24 students. The Department graduated its first set of graduates during the 1992/93 session. The unit was upgraded into a full Department in the year 2006. So far, a total of twenty-four (24) sets of students numbering two thousand four hundred and ten students (2,410) have graduated since the beginning of the programme. Profile

The Department then as Botany Unit of the Department of Biological Sciences) is one of the foundation Department in this University which was established and started the programmes in October 1977. The Botany programme offers courses leading to BSc Honours in Botany. It also carters for the needs of B.Sc. Education, B. Agric,



Pharmacy, Nursing, Radiography, MBBS, and DVM students. The core academic structure of the Department is developed based on the approved guidelines of the National Universities Commission (NUC) as enshrined in the Core Curriculum and Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) for Nigerian Universities as well as in other norms of the relevant stakeholders, e.g. professional societies. Its first batch of students graduated in 1980 and the unit has been graduating students ever since.

The Department started its postgraduate programme in the 1984–85 session and is still catering for the needs of both MSc and PhD students of Botany. The new M. Phil programme was developed to cater for the needs of students from other related fields of study for students wishing to convert to Botany for their PhD degree.

The academic staff of the Botany Unit participate actively in national and international conferences and workshops. In 1997 and 2017, the Department successfully hosted the national conference of the Botanical Society of Nigeria (BOSON).

Philosophy

The underlying philosophy of the Department is to promote a scientific understanding of plants, fungi, and related organisms. The concepts, study methodologies, and the uses of plants and fungi are elucidated. The role of plants in the conversion of simple inorganic elements to complex organic compounds that help sustain life on Earth is emphasized. The application of products and by-products of photosynthesis in food security, healthcare, and biodiversity conservation form a core component of the Study. Similarly, emphasis is given to the interaction of plants with other organisms and the physical environment for the maintenance of a balanced ecosystem.

Objectives

The objectives of the programme are to:

- i. Train students on the principles and methodologies of botanical research including handling the of equipment, instruments, and reagents.
- ii. Prepare the student for advanced research in Botany and related disciplines including plant breeding, biofuel studies, phytomedicine, landscaping and gardening, desertification control and rehabilitation of degraded land, erosion control, fodder and pasture provisions, plant protection, and mycology.
- iii. Promote awareness of the role of plants in economic well-being, healthcare, food security, and environmental conservation.
- iv. Promote creativity and problem-solving approach to emerging challenges in teaching, research, and use of plants through persistent effort, collaboration, and synergy with other researchers and all persons dealing with plants and plant products.



Profile

The Department of Biological Sciences was one of the four foundation departments of the Faculty of Science, which was established in 1977comprising Botany and Zoology Units. In 1989 and 1990, Microbiology and Biology Units were added, respectively, to increase the number of courses offered for B. Sc. Honours in Botany and Zoology to Microbiology and Biology. The Department also partly caters for the needs in Biology for BSc. Education, BSc. Agriculture, M.B.B.S. and D.V.M. students.

The Zoology programme had initially been of three years' period for the award of BSc. (Hons.) Degree in Zoology, but was later changed to four years. The programme trains students' in Entomology, Parasitology, Hydrobiology and Fisheries. The NUC minimum Academic Standard was introduced in 1992/93 session, which started while students were at UG I level and continued up to UG IV in the subsequent years.

In January 2022, the Zoology Unit was upgraded to a full fledged department following NUC's approval for the splitting of the then Faculty of Science into Faculties of Chemical and Life Sciences, and Physical and Computing Sciences.

Presently, the Zoology Department is running undergraduate programme based on the Minimum Academic Standards with some additional courses relevant to the area. The Department also offers Postgraduate Programme in Zoology with specializations in Entomology, Parasitology, Hydrobiology and Fisheries leading to the award of Master of Science (M.Sc.) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Degrees. In addition, the Department offers Post Graduate Diploma in Biological Sciences (PGDBS), in collaboration with Biology and Plant Science departments, designed for aspiring candidates seeking to upgrade their knowledge and/ or from other related areas of specialization an opportunity to qualify for admission into Zoology, Biology and or Plant Science departments for M.Sc. programmes.

Department of Educational Foundations

Profile

The Department of educational Foundations was coined out of the Department of Education, which was one of the two departments in the Faculty of Education and Extension Services. The Department of Education admitted its first students in 1977. By 1991, three (3) units were created from this Department. And since then they have been operating as independent units until 2010 when they were formally upgraded to Departments of their own.

Following the upgrading of the three units into full-fledged Departments, the Educational Foundations Unit in 2010 became the Department of Educational Foundations. The Department currently has twenty-seven (27) academic staff of different cadres from Graduate Assistants to Professors. The Department is (in line with the rest of the university) operating a two semester system. Final examinations are held at the end of each semester.

The four degree programmes introduced in 1984 gave rise to two sets of students:

- 1) Those with required 'O' levels and UME (now UTME) qualification are admitted into the four (4) year programme, while
- 2) Those with NCE/A-Level qualification came into the Department for three (3) year degree programme leading to BA Ed in different Art subjects.

The maximum periods of completion are as follows:

- 1) 4 year degree programme has a maximum period of 6 years
- 2) Direct entry students have a maximum period of 5 years.

The students offer Education courses in the Department, while major and minor teaching subjects are taken from various disciplines/ departments. The former Department of Education started to offer M. Ed programs in 1985. It started with M. Ed in Educational Psychology and Educational Administration and Planning. In 1987, the Department mounted a Ph. D programme in Educational Psychology. 1988 and 1989 saw the introduction of M. Ed in Sociology of Education and Guidance and Counselling respectively. Postgraduate Diploma in Education was introduced in 1997. In 2004/2005 academic session, M. Phil programmes in Educational psychology,



Sociology of Education, Educational Administration and Planning, Guidance and Counselling and Philosophy of Education came into existence. Presently, all these programmes are offered in the Department. At present there are about one hundred and seventy-five (175) postgraduate students running various courses at the Masters, M. Phil, Ph. D and Postgraduate Diploma levels in the Department.

Vision

To produce quality graduates in education that can compete effectively in national and international labour market. And contribute meaningfully to the nation at large.

Mission

The mission of the department is the preparation and training of students with broad knowledge, skills and backgrounds to be able to teach at secondary school level and the production of high level manpower in the area of Education in order to meet the challenges of Education in modern day Nigeria.

Profile

The Department was a unit under the 'Department of Education' which was set up in October, 1977 with 35 students (offering either B.A. (Ed) or B.Sc. (Ed) courses) and three academic staff. The unit became a full-fledged Department in 2009 bearing the name: the Department of Curriculum Studies and Educational Technology. From October, 1977 to October, 1980, the old Department of Education operated a three-term system and examination were conducted at the end of each term. From October, 1980 to date, the Department has (in line with the rest of the University) been operating a two-semester system. Final examinations are held at the end of each semester.

The students' enrolment has risen from 35 in 1977 to 509 in 2018. The core staff strength of the Department also rose from 3 in 1977 to 16, 14 academic and 2 non-academic.

The B. Sc. Ed programmes that the Department offers are:

- 1) B.Sc. Ed (Economics), and
- 2) B.Sc. Ed (Geography)

The students offer Education courses in the Department and other Departments in the Faculty, while teaching subjects are taken from various Departments.

The Department started M. Ed, M. Phil and Ph. D Language Education in 2004 when it was a unit. It has expanded the Postgraduate programmes to Educational Technology and Curriculum Studies

Vision

The vision of the Department is to be a centre of excellence for the training of social science teachers that will contribute to national development.



Mission

To produce quality social science teachers to meet the educational demands of the 21st century and beyond and provide community services to all under the most conducive environment in line with the national policy on education.

Philosophy

and Extension Services along with 4 other pioneering Faculties were established to start academic activities in the university. The Department of Education was among the 2 departments established in the Faculty. The Department offers various degree programmes including Bachelor of Science Degrees in Education B. Sc. (Ed). The programmes are: - B. Sc. (Ed) Mathematics - B. Sc. (Ed) Biology - B. Sc. (Ed) Chemistry – B. Sc. (Ed) Physics.In1993 the Department of Education was split into 3 academic units, namely; - Science and Vocational Education Unit - Educational Foundations Unit, and – Curriculum Studies and Educational Technology Unit, The 3 units continued to operate with a Head and run relevant degree programmes in their areas of specialization. All the 3 units were answerable to Head of Department of Education. The Science and Vocational Education Unit continued to run the 4 degree programmes in Science and mathematics as mentioned earlier. In 2009, the 3 academic units were upgraded into full-fledged degree awarding departments. Thus, the Department of Science and Vocational Education has come into being from the science and vocational education unit of the department of education. The new department has eleven (11) academic staff, 4 non-academic staff and approximately students from UG I-IV as per 2009/2010 academic session. Furthermore, the Department as of now offers both full-time and Part-time undergraduate Degree programmes. For full-time, the following programmes are run by the Department. – B. Sc. (Ed) Mathematics – B. Sc. (Ed) Biology – B. Sc. (Ed) Chemistry – B. Sc. (Ed) Physics - B. Sc. (Ed) Agricultural Science and B. Sc. (Ed) Computer Science. On a Part-time basis, the following Degree Programmes are offered: – B. Ed Agricultural Sciences Education - B. Ed Biology Education - B. Ed Chemistry Education - B. Ed Physics Education - B. Ed Integrated Science Education - B. Ed Mathematics Education - B. Ed Computer Education. The running of Postgraduate programmes began in the defunct Department of Education in 1985 with M. Ed and Ph. D Science Education, while M Ed Mathematics Education was introduced in 1989/1990 session. Ph.D Mathematics Education programme was introduced in 2004/2005 session. The Department also offers M. Phil in Science and Mathematics Education.

Profile

The BLIS full time programme is an offshoot of the Diploma in Library Science (DLIS) and the Part-Time B.Ed Library and Information Science (B.Ed. LIS) which were started in the University far back in 1993 and 2003 respectively. Since then, considerable number of students both programmes have graduated, most of whom are now working in various libraries and related institutions across the country.

The Senate approved the establishment of the Department of Library and Information Science and the commencement of the full-time Bachelor of Library and Information Science (BLIS) programme in the Faculty of Education and Extension Services on 25th September 2019. Consequently, the programme was approved by the National Universities Commission (NUC) on 23rd February, 2021, following a successful resource assessment visit conducted by the NUC panel on 9th December, 2020. Furthermore, the BLIS programme was equally approved/recognized by the Librarians' Registration Council of Nigeria (LRCN) on 1st September, 2021, following a visit to the Department by the LRCN team led by the Acting Registrar/CEO on 18th August, 2021.

Initially, sixty-six (66) students were admitted into the programme and lectures commenced in the 2020/2021 academic session on 13th October, 2021. The 66 fresh students were matriculated on 20th December, 2021 while orientation programme was organized for them by the Department on 22nd December, 2021.

Currently, the following programmes are being run by the Department:

- 1. BLIS Library and Information Science (Full Time)
- 2. BLIS (Ed) Library and Information Science (Part-Time)
- 3. Diploma Library and Information Science (Full Time)

Philosophy of the Programme

The philosophy of the programme is to provide theoretical and practical knowledge and skills adequate for the production of qualified Library and Information professionals competent to manage and serve in all types of libraries and information



systems, archives, documentation centre, media and other related organisations/establishment.

This will be achieved through intensive teaching of Library and Information Science curriculum, relevant educational courses, basic skills in Information and Communication Technologies (ICT), as well as inculcation of the right attitudes to work integrated with the basic instruction in language development that will ensure proficiency in both oral and written communication and good inter-personal relations. Integrated into the programme are practicum and industrial attachment for the enhancement of practical experience in the profession.

Objectives of the Programme

The specific objectives of the programme are to:

- 1) Produce competent library and information professionals for the management of all types of libraries and information systems, archives, documentation centres, media and allied institutions.
- 2) Provide high level library and information manpower needed for national and human development.
- 3) Equip the graduates of the programme with relevant theoretical knowledge, practical skills and techniques that will enable them to teach, conduct research and development activities in the Library and Information Science field.
- 4) Encourage the spirit of enquiry and creativity among the Library and Information professionals so that they are capable of understanding the emerging concepts on the role of information in a complex, multi-cultural, multi-ethnic and largely non-literate society like Nigeria.
- 5) Provide graduates with the intellectual and professional background adequate and suitable for employment in all areas of human endeavours.
- 6) Provide an understanding and skills in the application of communications technologies in library and information work.

The main objective was to offer an opportunity for great breadth of learning, whereby Civil Engineers with proven abilities can be produced for the country. The Department of Information and Communication Engineering (ICE) obtained the National University Commission's (NUC) approval to commence academic activities in the 2018/2019 Academic Session on 19th June, 2018. The Department's name was formally known as the Department of Information and Communication Technology but has been changed by the Senate of the university on the 11th January, 2024 because of the recommendation by the Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN). 

The new Faculty in 2001 disengaged from the Faculty of Social Sciences and moved to its new building. The Faculty held its inaugural and first Faculty Board meeting on Thursday, 2nd May 2002 in its Conference Room. It was chaired by the Dean, Prof A. D. Sheidu and in attendance were ten staff, two



representatives from the Faculties of Social Sciences and Science and the Faculty Officer as Secretary. The Faculty has three Departments: Accounting, Business Administration and Public Administration with such pioneer Heads of Department as Dr. A. M. Bashir for Accounting, Dr. S. M. B/Yauri (now Late) for Business Administration and Mal. M. A. Umar for Public Administration.

From a modest beginning in 2001 with ten (10) academic staff, the Faculty grew in strength and by the end of 2023 it has Forty-Eight (48) academic staff of different ranks. In addition, the faculty is pushing for more academic programmes aimed at expanding it by creating additional Units/Departments. In this direction, five additional programmes have received NUC Resource Verification Exercise in 2023. These programmes are B. Sc Taxation, B. Sc. Marketing, B. Sc. Entrepreneurship, B. Sc. Employment Relations and Human Resource Management, and B. Sc. Local Government and Development Studies respectively. The faculty is headed by a substantive Dean.

Accreditation Status of Programmes

The academic programmes run in the faculty both undergraduate and postgraduate are all accredited by the regulatory body - the National Universities Commission (NUC).

Students Enrolments and Statistics

Annually, large number of applicants apply for admission into the Management/Administration courses being run by the three departments in the Faculty. Both undergraduate and postgraduate programmes attract a lot of candidates and the enrolment rate is high.

Collaboration, Linkages and Partnerships

The Faculty enjoys the support and partnerships of all the accounting professional bodies in the country, including ANAN, CITN, and ICAN. Specifically, ANAN and ICAN have been donating books and computers to the department over the years. ICAN accredited the Department of Accounting, allowing graduates to receive exemptions in their professional examinations. Additionally, the Association of National Accountants of Nigeria (ANAN) constructed and equipped an Accounting Research Centre within the Faculty – Leadership, Accounting, Development, and Networking (LADAN). The Centre was commissioned on 18th April, 2019. Currently, the Centre is utilized for research in the areas of Accounting and Finance.

Staff Training and Development

Staff training and development in the Faculty during the period under review recorded a remarkable success. One academic staff from the Department of Accounting obtained a PhD in Accounting from Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto and another one is still progressing with their studies in Nasarawa State University. Similarly, one academic staff of the Department of Public Administration obtained a PhD from a Malaysian University, and another two academic staff from the same Department are still on their PhD and M.Phil programmes respectively.



Faculty Library

The Faculty has a fully established and functional library with a seating capacity of over 100 readers. It is stocked with large collection of current books on all aspects of Administration/Management disciplines, as well as volumes of current journals on different aspects of management sciences. The e-library section provides access to subscribed databases, including Science-Direct and EBSCOhost. The library is manned by competent librarians who were deployed from the University's central library. It is also indexed with proper cataloging, which facilitates the retrieval of books and journals. The faculty library operates from Monday to Friday, including Saturday.

Department of Accounting

The Department of Accounting came into being in 2001 with the establishment of the Faculty of Management Sciences. Currently (2023), there are fourteen academic staff comprising six professors (one on visiting), four Associate professors, two senior lecturers and two lecturers I. Eleven of the staff are Ph.D. holders, two are M.Sc. holders undergoing Ph.D. programmes and are at various levels of completion. This team of intellectuals has been updating itself through attendance of seminars, workshops and conferences both locally and at international levels which resulted in the publication of quality papers and articles in both local and international reputable journals. Since its inception, five members of the academic staff of the department have left the service of the university.

The Department kicked-off with only a Bachelor of Science degree programme. Currently, it runs a number of programmes including sub-degree, B. Sc. Accounting part-time, Postgraduate Diploma in Accounting and Finance (PGDAF), M.Sc. in Accounting and Finance, M. Phil Accounting and Finance and Ph.D. in Accounting and Finance. The entire Programme has been fully accredited by the NUC. The masters in Taxation, Master of Accounting and Finance, and Master of Treasury Management proposals have all secured Senate's approval having passed through Departmental Board, Faculty Board and Academic Planning Committee levels. They are now with NUC awaiting resource verification. A proposal for B.Sc. taxation has passed NUC resource verification and is awaiting approval.

The Department enjoys the support of and partnership with all the accounting professional bodies in the country which include ANAN, CITN, and ICAN. Specifically, ANAN and ICAN have been donating books and computers to the department over the years. ICAN has accredited the department which allows graduates of the department to enjoy exemptions in their professional examinations. CITN on its part, has endowed a professorial chair in taxation. A professor in the Department was appointed as Chairman.

Department of Public Administration

The Department housed the B.Sc. Degree Programme in Public Administration, which started with its establishment in 2001. Currently, the Department has twelve (12) staff members, including ten PhD holders. The first batch of graduates of the programme passed out in the 2003/2004 academic session.

Aside from the B.Sc. programme, the Department has a PhD, MPhil/PhD, MSc, and an MPA (Master of Public Administration) programme, which was introduced in the 2008/2009 academic session, as well as a Postgraduate Diploma Programme in Public Administration (PGDPA). Profile

The then Dean and Chairman of the Faculty Board of Science, Professor M. G. Abubakar, at its 185th Board meeting held on Friday, 1st December 2016, constituted the Faculty Strategic Committee in 2016, chaired by Professor Tukur Adamu. The Committee recommended the splitting of the Faculty of Science into Faculty of Physical Sciences and Faculty of Life Sciences as well as upgrade of the academic units to full-fledged departments. The recommendations were upheld by the Faculty Board. The University Management after due consideration modified the nomenclature to Faculty of Physical and Computing Sciences and Faculty of Chemical and Life Sciences.

Furthermore, at the 327th meeting of the Senate held on Monday, 1st July 2019, the recommendations of the Faculty Board were upheld as amended. The approval of the Senate was forwarded to the National Universities Commission (NUC) which also approved the split.

The Faculty of Physical and Computing Sciences comprises of the following departments:-

- ii Department of Geology
- iii. Department of Mathematics
- iv. Department of Physics and
- v. Department of Statistics.

In 2023, the NUC further approved the commencement of the following degree programs:

The faculty has eight Laboratories across the five Departments which are used for teaching, student practicals. These include the Computing Laboratory, Mathematics Laboratory, Statistics Laboratory. Others are Petrology/Microscopy, Sedimentology and Geochemistry Laboratories in Geology Department and the General Physics Laboratory. The faculty also has a shared central Teaching Laboratory that accommodates over three hundred students at a time for general chemistry and physics practicals. The faculty also has several other ICT equipped laboratories for the conduct of CBT examinations as well as conference halls of world class standards.

Apart from the undergraduate programs, the faculty also has robust Postgraduate programmes domiciled across the five Departments.

Profile

Established in 1992 as a Unit under the defunct Department of Mathematics, Faculty of Science, the Department of Computer Science is one of the earliest Computer Science training avenues in Northern Nigeria. Over the years, the Department has trained a pool of manpower in computing that presently support various organisations both within and outside Nigeria. The Department offers courses leading to BSc/PgD/MSc/MPhil/PhD in Computer Science and Master of Information Technology (MIT). The Department also runs a Diploma in Computer Science programme in with the UsmanuDanfodivo University Consultancy Services (UDUCons). Recently, the University introduced BSc.degree in Cybersecurity and BSc. Software Engineering in the Department with the first set of students on the programmes admitted in the 2023/2024 academic session. The programmes of Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, Robotics and postgraduate programmes in Data Science, Cybersecurity, Artificial Intelligence and Software Engineeringare also under consideration. The Department has grown to have over twenty academic staff most of whom are experts in various fields of Computing such as Artificial Intelligence, Computer Networks, Cybersecurity, Software Engineering, and Mobile Computing.

Administrative Structure

The Head of Department is the chief academic and administrative officer and is usually appointed by the Vice Chancellor for a period of two years renewable for another two years at the discretion of the Vice Chancellor. Profile

The Department of Geology was established based on a recommendation, at the end of a one-day international workshop on the hydrocarbon potentials of the Sokoto Basin, which was held on Thursday, 30th April, 2009, to establish the Department of Geosciences in the University with the mandate to further engage in research activities on these potentials. The University Senate, at its 275th meeting on Wednesday 9th January 2013 approved the establishment of the Department to commence BSc Geology degree programme from 2012/2013 session.

The programme started during the 2012/2013 session with 23 students. The Department took off from its then temporary one (1) office and a laboratory in Physics Department of the old Faculty of Science. However, after a session, the Department was relocated to old Faculty of Law building, where it was allocated (5) five offices (including the Head of Department's office).

At the initial stage the Department had three laboratories; one in the former Faculty of Law library, one located at the Department of Biochemistry and the other at the Physics Department. Currently, the Department has a new building consisting of (four) 4



laboratories, (nine) 9 offices including preparation rooms, and technologist offices located at the Department's permanent site close to the Department of Energy and Applied Chemistry.

Profile

The Department of Physics was established as one of the foundation departments of the former Faculty of Sciences in 1977. At present, the Department runs two undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The Department also caters for the needs of B.Sc. Biology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Computer, Geology, Mathematics, Microbiology, Plant Science, Statistics, Zoology, Education, Engineering and Agricultural Science. The Department also provides services to the College of Health Sciences and Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.

Vision

The undergraduate and the Postgraduate programmes in the Department of Physics are designed to provide students with a sound, broad and balanced foundation in Physics' knowledge and skills anchored in courses which are oriented towards practical development. The programme is designed to achieve the millennium goals of the Federal Government of Nigeria, bearing in mind the necessary skills, understanding and attitude that graduates of the programme will need to be successful in their careers and daily lives.

Mission

The Department of Physics aspires to eradicate poverty and restore the dignity of the black man by recognizing and developing competencies and knowledge; encourage innovative thinking through intensive Physics education.

Philosophy

The programme is designed to produce graduates with a sound knowledge of the basic conceptual and theoretical frameworks of classical, quantum and modern physics, who are capable of pursuing successful careers in many areas of human endeavours such as teaching, research, transportation, petroleum, communications, weaponry, electronics and nuclear industries.

Profile

The Department of Statistics is one of the new departments that emerged from the splitting of former Faculty of Science and the upgrade of academic units to departments by the University Senate at its 327th special meeting held on Friday 1st July, 2019. The creation of the Department was approved by the National University Commission (NUC) on 17th March, 2021. The Department has a responsibility of mounting programmes in statistics at both graduate and undergraduate levels. Prior to the creation of the Department, degree programmes in statistics are offered in the old Statistics Unit, which was established in 1992 under the Department of Mathematics of the old Faculty of Science. At present, the Department is under the Faculty of Physical and Computing Sciences

A four-year B. Sc. Degree programme in statistics started with the establishment of the Statistics Unit of the Department of Mathematics in 1992 with a view to producing competent statisticians in both theory and practical statistics. At present, the programme, has received full accreditation status by the NUC during 2019 accreditation exercise. The first batch of graduates of the programme passed out at the end of 1996/1997 session. Since then, graduates are produced each session and most of them are now in central positions in banks, oil and gas sectors, Universities, National Population Commission, Polytechnics, Colleges of Education, Federal and State. Ministries among others.

Similarly, Postgraduate Programmes in Statistics are offered with specialization in Tine series, Sampling Survey, Design of Experiment, Applied Statistics, Quality Control, Survival Analysis and Pattern Recognition leading to the award of Master of Science (M.Sc.) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Degrees. In addition, Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics (PGDS) programme was developed to carter for aspiring candidates with deficiencies in related areas of speialisation qualify for admission into the Department for M.Sc. programme. The Department also provides service courses to some departments and faculties in the University such as the Faculties of Agriculture, Education and Extension Services, Life and Chemical Sciences among others.

Profile

The Faculty of Social Sciences and Administration was among the pioneer faculties of the university, formally established in 1975. In 2011, the Faculty was split into two, i.e., the Faculty of Social Sciences and the Faculty of Management Sciences. The present Faculty of Social Sciences comprises four departments: Economics, Geography, Sociology and Political Science. The pioneer Dean of the Faculty of Social Science has Prof. M. Abdel-Rehim (1976–1977). The current Dean of the Faculty is Prof. C. U. Aliyu (2021-to date). The Faculty has six laboratories across the four departments, which are used for teaching and learning. These include the Geographic Information System (GIS) Laboratory, the Soil and Hydrology Laboratory, and the Weather Observatory Units, all in the Geography Department. The Department also has an econometric laboratory housed in the Economics Department, an audio-visual laboratory housed in the Sociology Department, and an ICT unit. Apart from undergraduate training, the Faculty has robust postgraduate training programmes domiciled across the four departments. These comprise both academic and professional programmes that are well-sought and attract students and researchers from different parts of the world. The programmes include a Master of Science (M.Sc.), a Master of Philosophy (MPhil), and a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Economics. Geography, Political Science and Sociology.

In order to ensure sustainability and further contribute to nation-building and meeting societal needs, the Faculty also runs a number of professional programmes domiciled across the four departments. The programmes include the Master of Gender and Development (MGED), Master in Geographic Information Systems (MGIS.) and Postgraduate Diploma in Geographic Information Systems (PGD GIS), all in the Geography Department. In the Economics Department, there are professional programmes such as Postgraduate Diploma in Banking and Finance and Masters



Programme in Banking and Finance (MBF). In the Political Science Department, there is a Masters rogramme in Governance and Public Policy and a Masters in International Affairs and Diplomacy (MIIAD). The Department of Sociology offers a Masters in Social Policy (MSP) and a Diploma in Crime Prevention Management and Control (DCM). In addition, the faculty has over the years maintained its excellent tradition of hard work and commitment to service among both the teaching and non-teaching staff, which has been reflected in the last National Universities Commission (NUC) ranking, in which this faculty was placed among the best faculties of social sciences in the Nigerian universities' ranking. All the departments of the Faculty obtained full accreditation which was granted during the last NUC Accreditation Exercise.

A number of special programmes have been initiated by the Faculty over the years in order to re-orient both staff and students and ensure cross-cutting and sharing of knowledge through the Faculty Seminar Series. The Faculty National Conference was also initiated and sustained. Through its departments, the Faculty hosted national conferences of some professional bodies, such as the Nigerian Meteorological Society (NMets) and the Association of Nigerian Hydrological Sciences (ANHS).

Mission

The Faculty aims at providing a convenient and enabling environment for teaching, learning and research in order to transform the socio-economic environment to meet societal needs through credible research, innovation and Promotion of academic values for sustainable development.

Vision

Department of Economics



Prof. (Mrs) H. Abdullahi Head of Department

Profile

The Department of Economics is one of the four foundation departments of the then Faculty of Social Sciences and Administration, which was established in 1977. The Department offers courses leading to a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics, a Master of Science in Economics, and PhD in Economics. In addition, the Department offers a Post-graduate Diploma and Masters in Banking and Finance. Also, in collaboration with UDUCONS, the Department runs a Diploma in Banking and Finance. Looking back to the last four decades, the Department has recorded significant progress, both in terms of student intake and staffing. From only 3 students in 1981, the number of graduates rose to 6 in 1982; 117 in 1999; 120 in 2006; 140 in 2013; and 257 between 2018 and 2021. By the same token, the number of academic staff has equally registered significant improvement, rising from 3 at inception to 28 in 2018; 24 by 2019; and 26 by 2023. Out of the total of 27 members of staff, 13 are professors, all of them serving full-time, but two (2) died: one (1) on November 18th November, 2022, and the other on 27th May, 2023. There are two (2) Readers, one (1) is visiting without pay, and two (3) Senior Lecturers one of whom is on secondment and one (1) is visiting, while one (1) is on contract. As for the remaining members of academic staff (five of whom are on study leave), seven (7) of them are in the Lecturer I position, one (1) on Lecturer II, and one Assistant Lecturer. Our members of staff have achieved both local and international recognition, making frequent contributions in their respective fields of endeavour, especially the Nigerian Economic Society, the TETFund Annual National Research Fund competition, etc.

Administrative Structure

The Head of Department is the chief administrative officer and is usually appointed by the Vice Chancellor for a period of two years, but position it is renewable at the discretion of the Vice Chancellor. In running the Department, the Head is usually supported by a number of standing committees, which include but are not limited to the admissions committee, the promotions committee, and the DTLC committee, among others. Several *ad hoc* committees are also set up from time to time, as situation demands. In addition, the major tasks in the Department are assigned to coordinators (officers) to support the Head of Department; they include the Examinations Officer, who handles all the examination issues for undergraduate



students. The postgraduate coordinator, who coordinates all the activities of Academi c Postgraduate programmes (M.Sc. and PhD). Our Master in Banking and Finance as a professional programme is coordinated by a separate officer. We also have an officer coordinating our diploma programme under the UDUCONS.

Accreditation Status

The Department is currently enjoying full accreditation status arising from the 2019 accreditation exercise.

The Department of Economics in collaboration with the International Institute for Islamic Thought (IIIT) Kano, organized a workshop for Teachers of Islamic Economics in the Tertiary institutions in the North-western zone of Nigeria. The theme of the workshop was "Three Decades of Teaching Islamic Economics at Usmanu Danfodiyo University: The Journey so far and the Challenges for Sustainability". The workshop was attended by participants from tertiary institutions from Katsina, Zamfara, Sokoto, Kebbi and Niger states.



On the other hand, because of the academic programmes that we run in the Department, we normally organize seminars for postgraduate students, as part of their graduation requirements. During the 2022/2023, the Department organized a Two-Day Professional Research Writing Skills Workshop for the final year undergraduate and postgraduate students of the Department and the general public at large. It took place on the 11th -12th August, 2023 at the Faculty of Social Sciences Board Room. Participants from the North west zone like Katsina, Zamfara, Kebbi and Sokoto States were in attendance. The Department has just received approval from the Vice Chancellor to start an annual National Conference from 2024, with a tentative theme on: "Public Debt Management in Nigeria".

Profile

The Department of Sociology was one of the foundation departments established by the university in 1976. Teaching commenced in October 1977 with an initial five academic staff and twelve students. Despite the brain drain and the relatively high rate of staff turnover, the staff strength of the department has remained at an average of 12 over the years, but it is currently 20. Staff composition in terms of areas of specialisation, teaching, and research interest is diverse. This diversity enables the Department to have a wide range of national and international sociological experiences drawn from Jos, Kano, Zaria, Lagos, Ibadan, Ife, Sokoto, South Africa, Sudan, Britain, the United States, Germany, France, Malaysia, and Japan. Many members of staff have distinguished themselves nationally and internationally through their research, publications, and membership in professional associations. Currently, the composition of the academic staff includes 6 Professors, 1 Reader, 6 Senior Lecturers, 9 other lecturers (Lecturer I - Assistant Lecturer).

The first set of students—12—graduated in 1980. Since then, the number of graduates from the Department has multiplied several fold, and today, it has over 450 core sociology students. This is apart from the hundreds of students from other departments and faculties taking sociology courses from levels 1–3.

The philosophy of the programme remains close to the very humanistic concerns that played a critical role in the development of sociology as a scientific and academic discipline. More specifically, the programme is designed to enable students to gain a thorough grasp of sociological theories and methods, develop and sharpen their critical judgement as well as their observational, analytical and interpretative skills, and develop in them an ability to relate theory to practice with particular reference to developing societies in general and to Nigeria in particular.

Initially, the Department offered a three-year degree programme. In the 1984/85 session, a four-year degree programme was started, a measure that involved a general revision of the department's syllabi and course structure as determined by the National Universities Commission (NUC). The Department's programme was restructured, again, in 1989 a revision made it necessary in light of the experiences



gained from the implementation of the 4-year programme adopted five years earlier. The 1989 revision was also dictated by the need to streamline the programme with the NUC-approved Minimum Academic Standards (MAS) for Universities.

The undergraduate course in sociology at Usmanu Danfodiyo University is unique and very innovative in several respects. Beyond the 'core' conventional courses, there are innovative courses that deal with the sociology of Islamic Societies, Economy and Society in the Sokoto Caliphate, the Sociology of Pastoral Societies, etc., which try to expose students to issues and realities around them or which they will, in all probability, encounter in their future endeavours. The Department recently initiated a sub-unit of criminology and security studies. The Department awaits approval from NUC to mount the programme. Over the years, criminology has been taught as a subdiscipline of sociology, with a number of staff specialising in the area.

Vision

The underlying vision of the Department is to train and fortify students with academic, intellectual, methodological, theoretical as well as practical skills with which to confront social life and, more importantly, the causes and consequences of human social behaviour. The degrees should, at the end, provide exciting and challenging opportunities to explore fundamental and foundational issues about human social behaviour, social life, and social problems from both the theoretical and practical dimensions. Students will have the opportunity to engage in critical thinking about the various normative values or order, socio-cultural milieu, practices, and imbalances, including various social events, social structures, processes and social development. Overall, the programmes should allow students to acquire knowledge and develop skills in reasoning, analysis, imagination, and writing, which should prepare them to contribute to all facets of life relating to the sociological enterprise.

Mission

The mission of the programmes is to train students who should be able to build a career in the public and private sectors of the political economy and in academia, as well as be able to assist in the management of human society in all its various spheres, institutions, or organisations and to provide solutions to wide-ranging societal problems.

Objectives

The objectives of the programme include, but are not necessarily limited to, the following:

- Equip students with a thorough grasp of sociological concepts, theories, and methods with which to critically understand the history and dynamism of human societies:
- Develop the student's critical judgement and ability to observe, understand, analyse, and synthesise data on socio-economic problems using sociological methods and techniques that could enable objective identification of social issues and problems across societies and social formations;
- Frovide the appropriate environment that should raise the levels of creativity and promote the spirit of self-reliance in the students;



- ξ Stimulate and create an atmosphere for desirable behavioural changes that would help develop personal and social values that will accord to the development needs and goals of both the individual and society, broadly conceived, and in the context of (i) to (iv) above, and
- To produce graduates who should be able to fit into the various fields of human endeavour by entering into and building careers as academics in civil and public service, community affairs, public relations, policy analysts, information officers, state, industrial, and private personnel and intelligence security service operatives, correctional/prison services, journalists, social welfare officers, etc.

Department of Geography

Profile

The Department of Geography was one of the four foundation departments of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Administration established in 1977. The Department offers courses leading to a single honours degree in Geography. This is with a view to afford the graduate of geography to fit into the different fields of human endeavour in the private and public sectors of the economy. The courses are designed to examine the spatial dimension of the Physical, economic, social and olitical forces which are evident in the organisation of human societies and activities. In particular, they look at the interaction of these forces and how they change over time and operate at different scalar levels.

The undergraduate course in Geography is designed to provide training in the theory and practice of Geography with emphasis on thorough grounding infield techniques and the manipulation of modern tools. Over-specialisation is avoided at this level. Every five years the department reviews its programmes. This review is based on External Examiners report, and such reviews have reflected the talents of our various external examiners. These have brought our courses to match those taught in other Universities. The Department has continued to teach those courses it started with in 1978 but has reviewed the contents of some of them and included new ones. Local field studies courses are conducted every year for the 100 and 300 level students so as to encourage them cultivate an inquiring mind and to develop skills in the retrieval and Interpretation of geographic data.

With the introduction of computers as tools to make the study of geography more effective world-wide, a course in Geographical Information Systems (GIS) is now introduced and is made compulsory for both students majoring in Geography in the Social Sciences Faculty and those from the Faculty of Education so that they can make the best use of a computer as a system in establishing a geographic database for the purpose of storing, manipulating, analysing and synthesizing spatial information quickly and effectively. The inculcation of awareness of responses as well as the dominant issues of development in the immediate environment and the role of Geography in National development are emphasised.



The Department produced its first graduates in 1980. Since then, the Department has been producing graduates in increasing numbers. This syllabus in Geography therefore, is aimed at producing graduates infused with an enthusiasm to make a meaningful contribution to society.

Since the establishment of the Department in 1977, it has successfully gone through all the NUC accreditation exercises. In the 2006 nationwide accreditation, the University and, by extension, the Department ranked 1st along with Bayero University Kano. The Department hosted the NUC resource verification team in 2023, hence, it will soon start a program in Demography and Social Statistics.

The programme provides some basic professional background for a public affairs career. Training Facilities

1) The Medical/Veterinary Library currently has a total of 951 holdings specifically for the needs of the Veterinary Faculty. The Reference Section has adequately covered all areas of Veterinary Sciences. There are several international journals being subscribed to regularly (Veterinary Records, American Journal of Veterinary Research, British Veterinary Journal, Tropical Animal Health and Production, Journal of American Veterinary Medical Association, Surveillance, etc) in addition to the local ones such as the Nigerian Veterinary Journal, Zariya Veterinarian, Tropical Veterinarian, Sokoto Journal of Veterinary Sciences, and a host of others. The Library is also on the mailing list of a good number of journals and periodicals.

The Faculty also has a small collection of books in its Library made up of books mainly donated to the Faculty by individuals. These books are available to staff and students on request from the Deputy Dean. The Faculty is well equipped with internet facilities and connectivity through campus-wide fibre optic cabling and NCC broadband wireless internet.

2) The Veterinary Teaching Hospital: In order to give the students, the much-needed clinical exposure, the university has established the Veterinary Teaching Hospital located in the City Campus as an independent but integral part of the Faculty. The Hospital is made up of the Large and Small Animal Clinics as well as an Avian Clinic, Consulting Room, Records Room, a Pharmacy, Small and Large Animal Surgery and a Radiology Unit. The services of these Clinics are carried out in conjunction with the Departments of Parasitology and Entomology, Pathology and Microbiology.

There are ambulatory services to Fulani Herdsmen, Institutional Farms, and Livestock farmers. Similarly, the Public Health Clinicians visit the Abattoir regularly to perform meat inspection to ensure that animals slaughtered are fit for human consumption. The Veterinary Teaching Hospital in conjunction with the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Consultancy Services has also mounted programmes for the training of Animal Health Superintendents.

3) The Dabagi Farm: The Dabagi Farm, which serves as a Field Station, is located some 40km away from Sokoto town. It houses the teaching and research animals (cattle, sheep goats and equine) of the Faculty. The Farm plays a very significant role in the teaching of students of the Faculty in Animal Handling and Restraint, Medicine, Epidemiology etc. It also provides animals for surgery – wet lab and Gross Anatomy Practical (Dissection). The Faculty also utilizes the late Sidi Mamman Farms, Lumana Farm, Associates Farm, S.G. Adiya Farm in Sokoto metropolis for teaching of Herd Health, Dairy and Meat Science Technology and Fish Farming. Laboratory animals are kept and maintained by the Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology in the laboratory animal house located within the Campus.

Research Activities in the Faculty

The Faculty had shown great interest in research activities and has made a modest contribution to the research activities in the country, most especially on species/breeds of livestock indigenous to the sub-Saharan Africa that are at risk of being endangered. Currently, the Faculty conducts antimicrobial resistance research in animals sponsored by the Fleming Funds in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, the Federal Ministry of Environment, and Federal Ministry of Health. The Faculty also has a research focus committee responsible for steering and coordinating research activities in the faculty. The committee has the mandate to develop different research groups. Some of these include:

- 1) Anti-Microbial Resistance
- 2) Stem cells research and embryo technologies.
- 3) Drug residues in animal and animal by-product
- 4) Alternative sources of animal feeds
- 5) Ethno-veterinary practice and pharmacological evaluation of local herbs
- 6) Emerging and re-emerging zoonoses
- 7) Parasites of livestock and companion animals
- 8) PPR and Newcastle Diseases
- 9) Contagious Bovine Pleuro-Pneumonia
- 10) Assisted Reproductive Technologies in ruminants
- 11) Mastitis

Profile

The Postgraduate School (PGS) coordinates postgraduate level academic programmes for Faculties and College of Health Sciences within the University. The School was established in 1983 and admitted its first set of students from the foundation faculties in the same year. It graduated its first set (two graduates of M.Sc. Botany) in 1985. As part of its coordinating role, the Postgraduate School's mandate under the direction of the Board of Postgraduate School includes: Promoting the development and effective delivery of postgraduate programmes to address emerging national and international issues; and to maintain high standards and ensure high quality postgraduate programme output. Additionally, the Postgraduate School deals with all matters which have to do with admission, registration and records, examination of theses and dissertations, and official correspondence of postgraduate studies. It also regulates and offers advice on postgraduate programmes being offered in the University's affiliate institutions within the country.

The programmes that are currently being offered and coordinated by the Postgraduate School include: various Postgraduate Diploma Programmes cutting across all faculties, Master of Arts (MA), Master of Science (MSc), Master of Public Health (MPH), Master of Education (MEd), Master of Laws (LLM), Master of Business Administration (MBA), Executive Master of Business Administration (EMBA), Master of Public Administration (MPA), Master of Veterinary Medicine (MVM), Master of Philosophy (MPhil) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) across thirteen faculties and the College of Health Sciences. Profile

The Division of General Studies was one of the full-fledged academic units of the university established in 1977. The unit offers courses in General Studies leading to the award of degrees in various disciplines of academic endeavour. The courses of the Division have been made compulsory for all students in Nigerian universities at undergraduate level by the National Universities Commission (NUC) to promote national awareness and cohesion. The Division is responsible for the co-ordination of both academic and administrative matters related to the General Studies. The General Studies courses are examined in the semester in which they are taught at 100, 200 and 300 levels of a degree programme. All the courses are computed as part of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of every student at unde rgraduate level. The curriculum of General Studies is in line with the Benchmark Minimum Academic Standards for Undergraduate Programmes in Nigerian Universities. The training of the mind to have broad spectrum knowledge and attain goals in relation to diverse matters has been the concern of education. We live in the world where Science, Arts, Computer, Technology and ideas, men and materials interact to shape lives. The teaching of General Studies courses provides intellectual knowledge and training that equip students for life such that a graduate from any discipline can function effectively in all fields irrespective of his or her area of specialization.

Vision

The vision of the Division is to produce morally and intellectually sound graduates capable of directing projects in fields outside their area of specialization and are acceptable in the competitive global labour market.

Mission

The mission of the Division of General Studies is the preparation and training of students with broad knowledge, entrepreneurial skills and well-rounded background to become self-reliant and productive in order to compete favourably in the modern Nigeria labour market.

Goals and Objectives

Profile

The Sokoto Energy Research Centre (SERC), was established in 1982. It is one of the six (6) Energy Research Centres presently under the supervision of the Energy Commission of Nigeria (ECN) that was established in 1988.

Mission

The Government of Nigeria's prime mandate with the Commission is to promote sustainable clean energy development in Nigeria through the production of strategic plans and coordination of national policies on energy. Another cardinal principle and philosophy of the Centre is the adaptation of sustainable renewable energy technologies and utilization for national economic growth and social development. One of the Centre's socio-economic developmental objectives is to increase the adaptation; utilization and mainstreaming of sustainable renewable clean energy technologies in the Nigerian spatial economy.

Functions

SERC is a multi and interdisciplinary research, development (R&D) and innovation centre focusing on renewable clean energy resources & technologies development and energy-efficiency for sustainable livelihood.

It also carries out training and capacity development within these core mandate areas. More recently, SERC is one of the facilitators of Nigeria's efforts to meet Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) number Seven (7) and the objectives of Sustainable Energy for All (SE4ALL). This it does by helping to expand the contribution of renewable energy to the national electricity generation mix and increase access to electricity across the nation and the neighbouring countries.

Hence, specifically, renewable clean energy resources and technologies related to solar photovoltaic, solar thermal, wind, biomass/bioenergy and small-hydro are its core



mandate areas of activities - researching energy systems and technologies—and the science behind them—for a future powered by clean energy.

Additionally, its activities involve energy technologies management (i.e. efficiency, conservation and audit) and meteorological data collection, storage, processing and utilization as well as mainstreaming of environmental, economic and social consequences of renewable energy technologies and policies. Thus, SERC was established to create technological, scientific knowledge and skills necessary for R&D and Innovation in renewable energy resources and technologies development and energy-efficiency for sustainable development.

Facilities

SERC's state-of-the-art research, development and training facilities include solar photovoltaic module production plant; well-equipped and stocked science laboratories; electrical, woodwork and mechanical workshops and various types of instruments. These physical resources are deployed to provide robust and timely research outputs and avenue for ground-breaking technological innovations and collaboration with partners.

The Centre's R&D and training activities are guided and monitored by its Energy Research and Training Advisory Committee (ERATA) constituted by the Governing Board as provided for under the Statute of the Centre. SERC has about 30 core research staff, educators, and affiliate professional researchers from various faculties of the host Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto (UDUS), Energy Commission of Nigeria (ECN) and other partner institutions in Nigeria and around the globe.

Research and Development Activities

- A) Solar Electricity Supply Systems
 - Research, development and innovation in design, construction, installation and maintenance of solar photovoltaic electricity supply systems in the following categories:
 - a) Micro and Mini grid system (for rural and urban settlements) of various specifications as required by clients.
 - b) Solar Photovoltaic (Solar PV) electricity for homes, offices, hospitals, schools, commercial buildings, etc.
 - c) Solar PV Street and Estate Lighting.
 - d) Hybrid Power Plants (Solar/Wind, Solar/Diesel, etc.).
 - e) Smart Grid and Local/Regional Network Integration.
 - f) Site and resource assessment and feasibility studies.
 - Solar Incubator program, aimed at identifying potential PV projects enterprises in Nigeria by providing support to funding, commercial and technical knowledge transfer in partnership with the Nigerian Technology Incubation Centre (Sokoto office).
 - Consultancy, business development and training and capacity development (human resources and institutional) in accordance with international competency standards, certification and accreditation requirements and best practices.



B) Solar Thermal Heating Systems

- 1) Research, development and innovation in design, construction, installation and maintenance of solar thermal energy systems and carrying out experiments such as measurement of thermal conductivity and analysis of the performance of heat pumps, cooling towers and air conditioning systems. This also include the following categories:
 - a) Solar Thermal Water Heating Systems for domestic, commercial and industrial applications of various specifications as required by client.
 - b) Solar Thermal Dryer Systems for domestic, community, commercial and industrial applications of various specifications as required by client.
 - c) Solar Thermal Cooker Systems for domestic and commercial applications of various specifications as required by clients.
- Consultancy, business development, training and capacity development (human resources and institutional) in accordance with international competency standards, certification and accreditation requirements and best practices.

C) On-Going Research

- 1) Analysis and optimization of solar photovoltaic wind hybrid system for power generation in Nigeria.
- 2) Sustainable solar PV water pumping systems for irrigation in arid and semi arid zones of Nigeria project
- 3) Comparative study on the effect of temperature on mono-crystalline and polycrystalline solar cells
- 4) Investigation on the performance of solar PV system installed at SERC offices
- Analysis of solar radiation absorption capacity of mono-crystalline and polycrystalline solar cells

D) Training

- 1) Professional training workshop on solar photovoltaic installation (SPVI)
- 2) In house training on solar photovoltaic simulation machine
- 3) In house training on solar PV applications

E) Other Activities

- 1) Monitoring/ maintenance of existing solar PV systems
- 2) Feasibility study to relocate renewable energy village
- 3) Taking part in committee activities by SERC / UDUS

Bio-Energy Systems

- Research, development and innovation in design, construction, installation and maintenance of Biomass energy systems and solutions for domestic and commercial applications (homes, schools, restaurants, hotels, hospitals, prisons, emergency/displaced persons' camp sites etc.):
 - a) Biogas Cookers
 - b) Improved Wood Stoves (wood and wood-driven energy)
 - c) Gasifiers
 - d) Bio-fertilizers



- e) Biofuels (ethanol and biodiesel)
- f) Bio power Bio power electricity comes primarily from wood and agricultural residues that are burnt as fuel for cogeneration of electricity and heat in the industrial sector (such as in the pulp and paper industry).
- 2) Consultancy, business development, training and capacity development (human resources and institutional) in accordance with international competency standards, certification and accreditation requirements and best practices.

Research and Development Results of Improved Biomass Stoves for Field **Application**

The Sokoto Energy Research Centre has developed several renewable energy devices that are ready for use by the public. Some of these are stoves which include the improved wood stove made from clay, the improved metal stove and another version of improved metal stove called the rocket stove. The Centre has the capacity to produce as many as needed and train as many candidates as required for their construction, operation and maintenance. If built and maintained properly the stove can be used for up to 5 years or more. Deployment of these stoves in the communities will contribute to the nation's economy in several ways, some of which are:

- 1) Provide an impetus for developing various training programmes for the potters, artisans and other interested people on how to construct a variety of the improved wood stoves.
- 2) Then the training of the trainers programmes will also be established after some years of experience with the improved wood stoves.
- 3) Gainful employment and businesses may be provided for the trained persons.
- 4) The stoves conserve up to 50% of fuel wood and also save about 50% of cooking time. Two of the stoves have chimneys, which provide an outlet for the smoke. This sanitizes the cooking environment and reduces health hazards such as respiratory ailments that are associated with inhalation of smoke during cooking with conventional open-air three-stone type of stoves.
- 5) The deployment of the stoves for considerable length of time would drastically reduce desertification and soil erosion because of their efficient use of fuel wood.
- 6) Overall, the improved wood stoves will contribute to the economy through jobcreation, protection of the environment and public health.
- 7) The raising of fast-growing tree species all over the country will protect our environment from the adverse effects of climate change affecting all parts of the globe.

Fast-Growing Trees for Energy and Fortification of Green Belts

There are several fast-growing tree species that are adapted to different environments that can be raised for energy as well as provision of shelter belts for environmental protection. Examples are Leucaena, Delonix, Moringa and Eucalyptus species. The Centre has been conducting research and development in a number of these fastgrowing trees for quick energy supply.



The promotion of fast-growing trees would go a long way in creating job opportunities for our youth and unemployed graduates, reduce the menace of indiscriminate cutting down of trees for cooking and other domestic daily uses and also foster enrolment of rural girl in schools.

Wind Energy Conversion Systems & Meteorological Information System

- Research, development and innovation in design, construction, installation and maintenance of Wind Power Turbine Farms, System and Solutions (Standalone and/or Hybrid Wind Turbine) for rural electrification, household lighting and water supply/irrigation applications.
- 2) Meteorological Information System: Meteorological data collection, storage, analysis and presentation and dissemination to clients.
- Consultancy, business development, training and capacity development (human resources and institutional) in accordance with international competency standards, certification and accreditation requirements and best practices.
- 4) SERC's state-of-the-art wind research facilities that include wind energy conversion systems (WECS) rated from 400 watts to 10kilowatts, providing a venue for ground-breaking innovations and collaboration with partners for execution of R&D and community-level Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects.

Small Hydro Power System Development

- 1) Research, development and innovation in design, construction, installation and maintenance of Small Hydro Power system and solutions (Stand-alone and/or Hybrid) for rural electrification; for household lighting; irrigation and domestic water supply/irrigation applications.
- Consultancy, business development and training and capacity development (human resources and institutional) in accordance with international competency standards, certification and accreditation requirements and best practices.

Infrastructure

CASRAS is currently operating at its permanent building. The one-storey building consists of four large sample preparation laboratories and eight instrumentation laboratories. The sample preparation laboratories consist of Environmental Analysis Laboratory (EAL), Organic Preparation Laboratory I (OPL1), Organic Preparation Laboratory II (OPL2) and Microbial Analysis Laboratory (MAL). The analytical instrument laboratories consist of Atomic Spectroscopy Laboratory (ASL), Molecular Spectroscopy Laboratory (MSL), Gas Chromatograph Mass Spectrometry Laboratory (GCMS), X-Ray Spectrometry Laboratory (XSL), Instrumental Chromatography Laboratory (ICL), Electron Microscopy Laboratory (EML) and Chemical Reactor Laboratory (CRL). There are also stores, administrative and research offices, and a 90-seater auditorium.

Scientific Analytical Services: CASRAS is equipped with state-of-the-art instruments including GC-MS, FTIR, MP-AES, XRD, SEM, PCR, HPLC, UV-vis etc., and offers a variety of scientific analytical services for UDUS staff and students as well as external researchers. The Centre also provides bench space for interested researchers with unlimited access to routine laboratory equipment, and produces double distilled and deionised water for inverter batteries, medical equipment and laboratory uses.

Activities of the Centre

Training Services: Over the years, the Centre has been serving as a training ground for students from several departments of the university (Chemistry, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Pharmacy etc), where they are offered placement for Students Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) and internships.

A hands-on training workshop on Molecular Biology Techniques and Instrumentation was organised and hosted by the centre in collaboration with the National Association of Academic Technologist (NAAT) from 9th to 13th October, 2023. Participants at the workshop were trained on the Best Laboratory Practices as well as the working principle, operating procedure and basic maintenance of some of the state-of-the-art instruments available in the Centre including GC-MS, FT-IR and XRD.

Additionally, the Centre hosted the TETfund train-the-trainer (TTT) workshop for academic staff from different tertiary institutions in Nigeria in the month of March 2023. The 5-day training on "writing a fundable research proposal" was held in the 90-seater auditorium of the Centre.

Research Activities

CASRAS has a multidisciplinary research group which meets regularly to review research proposals written for grant application. Furthermore, research fellows in the centre present seminars during the regular research meetings to share their research findings for observations and input.

It is noteworthy that two research fellows of the centre have been selected for TETfund Institutional Based Research (IBR) grant for the year 2023.

Profile

TETFUND Center of Excellence in Urology and Nephrology (TCoE-UN) is one of the 12 pioneer Centers of Excellence established in Nigerian Universities by the Fund. The Vision of the Centre is to be an International Centre of Excellence for promotion of research, invention, manpower development and state of the art treatment of common Urologic, Uro-gynaecologic and Kidney disorders. The Centre has a mandate to apply knowledge gained from research and clinical trials to improve Urologic, Urogynaecologic and Kidney disease care, and to halt medical tourism and capital flight from Nigeria.

Mission

The mission of the Centre is to conduct research, pursue manpower development and advance the frontiers of knowledge via training and retraining, and render services of international standard to the teaming population of Urology, Urogynaecology and Kidney disorder patients and clientele. The Centre shall pursue manpower development by mounting training at PhD, Fellowship, MSc, Postgraduate Diploma, Post Basic and Post Fellowship levels, in addition to workshops, seminars and short courses. Other research priority areas include validation of clinical protocols and practice guidelines, as well as development of novel therapeutics in the management of Urological conditions and Kidney diseases.

The initial 15% and first trench of TETFund support have been effectively utilized. The progress, current status and activities of the Centre are hereby summarized and presented:

- The implementation plan booklet, the procurement plan, monitoring and evaluation report and additional evidence of results since last report are being compiled and forwarded to TETFund.
- 2. The Centre has a comprehensive Endourologic and Laparoscopic tower for Scar-less and Keyhole Urethral, Prostate, Bladder, Ureteric and Kidney surgery. In addition, there are also available and functional equipment for complex inter-sex surgery and kidney transplant surgery.

- 3. Residency training in Urology and Nephrology continues and new programmes are being mounted on Post Fellowship Training, MSc and PhD in Urology and Urology Nursing and Professional Post Graduate Diploma in Urology Nursing
- Comprehensive 'Sokoto Urology Data Base' is being established by the Centre
- In addition to 6 instructional courses reported earlier, the TCoE-UN has organized a national course on Basic Laparoscopic Surgery and International Seminar on Kidney Transplant in 2023.
- Five Post Graduate Programmes have been accredited by National Universities' Commission; with no objection from Nursing and Midwifery Council on commencement of professional Post Graduate Diploma in Urology Nursing. This is the 1st professional post graduate urology nursing programme in Africa
- TCoE-UN has commenced Post Fellowship training in Urethral and Genital Reconstruction and is the 1st and only post fellowship level urology training in Nigeria.
- TCoE-UN has started attracting research grants and we have launched a giant project on Sokoto Urology Database collating information related Urologic diseases in the region.
- We have also commenced production of manuals of protocols and guidelines on common urological procedures starting with urethral reconstruction and intersex surgery.
- 10. A total of 14 publications in highly rated indexed journal are being published by the Centre between July, 2022 and December, 2023.
- 11. The Centre has acquired additional facilities and is now fully equipped to conduct Kidney Transplant in collaboration with the prestigious University of Mansoura Egypt. Recruitment of patients for same has already commenced.
- 12. The Centre continues to provide training for interns and resident on short rotation
- 13. TCoE-UN has sponsored training of Urologists, Nephrologists, Nurses and other relevant staffs on Kidney Transplant at University of Mansoura Egypt as a component of MoU signed with the institution to assist TCoE-UN establish services and training on Kidney Transplant, as tabulated below.
- 14. In addition to MoU signed with University of Mansoura Egypt, the Centre has also signed an MoU with University of Alberta, Canada to further strengthen Urology and Nephrology training on research. Find the MoU Attached
- 15. The centre has commenced fabrication of laparoscopic training models. It is also in the process of producing its own enzymatic solution to solve the challenges of obtaining these, difficult to import, solutions that are essential for the protection of delicate endoscopes.
- 16. The Centre is already contributing in curbing Medical and Training tourism, thus reducing capital flight from Nigeria. Register of more than 120 patients halted from going outside the country for surgery over the last five years is verifiably available at the Centre

The Centre for Peace Studies (CPS) started its activities in July 2007. The Statutory Mandate of the CPS include teaching, research and community service. Principally the Centre is mandated to provide training in the area of Peace and Security Studies as well as in Conflict Resolution Strategies among other related issues.

Vision

The vision of the CPS is in line with the general vision of the University which is to be a Centre of Excellence for the attainment of important national goals in different fields of human endeavor. The vision of the Centre in particular is to attain excellence in teaching and research for the promotion of sustainable peace locally, nationally and globally.

Mission

The mission of CPS is to engage in quality collaborative research; and provide training in conflict analysis, conflict resolution and security awareness to persons and communities under the most conducive condition for learning regardless of social class, gender, race and religion.

Activities of the Centre in 2023

- a) A Public Lecture Series tagged "Peace and Security Lecture" has been introduced and the Maiden Edition of the lecture took place in 2023 after the inauguration of a new civilian administration in Nigeria. The title of the lecture was "Setting the Agenda for Peacebuilding and Sustainable Democracy in Nigeria".
- b) In order to contribute to the discourse on military intervention in governance through coup d'état, the Centre organized an international symposium on the political crisis in Niger Republic following the overthrow of the civilian administration of Muhammad Bazoum. The theme of the symposium was "The Niger Crisis and the Future of Democracy and African Integration. The symposium was held on 28th August 2023.

- c) The Second National Conference took place in early October 2023. The theme of the conference was "Tackling Security Challenges for Sustainable Development and Democracy in Nigeria"
- d) Also, in pursuit of the mandate of the Centre to carry out researches and make interventions as well as look for solutions to social, economic and political crises, a one-day International Symposium on "Pathways to Enhanced Security and Conflict Resolution – Northwestern Nigeria and the Middle East in Perspective" was organized in November 2023.

Profile

The creation of the Centre for Islamic Studies was as a result of the desire, partly to serve the immediate local Community and partly to reserve a historical legacy i.e the Jihad of Sheikh Usmanu bin. Fodiyo. Even though the University's Departments of Arabic and Islamic Studies catered for the undergraduate and post-graduate needs of the Muslims, it was felt that the introduction of certificate and diploma courses in Da'wah, Arabic and Islamic Studies by the Centre for Islamic Studies would help satisfy the educational needs of persons, especially those who had not been to formal schools. In addition, research, into the writings of the Sokoto Jihad Scholars and some community oriented programmes made the creation of the Centre a wise decision by the University. This report intends to survey the growth and development of the Centre for Islamic Studies and bring out its contributions to the development of learning, research and community development within the scope of its mandate as provided by the statute that created it.

Setting up of the Centre

The Governing Council of the Usmanu Danfodiyo University formally approved the statute setting up the Centre for Islamic Studies. Thus, the dream of having a third tier Arabic and Islamic Studies unit in the University to promote learning and research in Arabic and Islamic Culture in general and awareness about writings of the *Sakkwato Jihad* Scholars was actualized.

In accordance with the statute of its establishment, the Centre was expected to pursue the following aims:

- 1) To promote the study of and research in Islam, its institutions and related disciplines and its culture with special reference to the Northern Nigerian environment.
- 2) To disseminate the results of such studies and research;
- 3) To acquire and or ensure the proper preservation of Islamic literature, particularly the Sokoto Jihad, and, as far as practicable, to edit, translate and publish same:
- 4) To organize courses of instructions in Islamic studies for advanced degree, diploma, certificates as well as similar academic pursuits to meet societal needs



- and to examine candidates in same regarding their competence for academic distinctions;
- 5) To serve as a forum through symposia, conferences, seminars, etc for the exchange and dissemination of research findings in Islamic Studies and related disciplines, and to publish the results of such deliberations in appropriate reports; and
- 6) To carry out such other assignments as may be deemed necessary by the Senate and/ or the Board of Management for the Centre for the realization of these aims.

Components of the Centre and their Activities

The Centre *ab initio* was charged with the responsibility of creating programmes with direct bearing on the lives of the people of the University's immediate catchment areas in particular and Nigeria in general. Accordingly, the Centre introduced research oriented programmes, such as seminars, acquisitions of manuscripts and books, publication of a journal and bibliography of research in Islam.

In the area of Community Service, programmes such as National Qur'anic Recitation Competition, National Islamic Quiz Competition for Senior Secondary Schools, Intensive Tajweed Course, Imam Workshop and Ajami Project were introduced. A two -



year Certificate and three-year diploma programmes in Arabic and Islamic Studies were also introduced as well as extramural classes for both men and women.

Three units were also created namely Research, Community Service and Teaching in 1988 to enhance proper handling of these programmes.

Specialist Library

The Centre for Islamic Studies continued to maintain and enhance its specialist Library with seeking for donations of books by donors. From 2012 to date the specialist library acquired about 4500 assorted books, which included manuscripts written by the Sokoto Jihad leaders, Arabic and Islamic Studies references, English references and research Journals. The library is now named as Professor Abubakar Aliyu Gwandu Arabic and Islamic Studies Library, in his honour shortly after his death

Al-Nahdah Journal

The Board of Management of the Centre approved the setting up of Al-Nahdah Journal to compliment researches being carried out by staff in the Centre, and publishes research reports from within and outside the Centre. It was in 1998 that the first issue came out, In the year 2012 the 8th issue came out, while the 9th issue came out. In 2015. The 10th issue Nos. 1&2 was published in 2019. It is the hope of the present editorial board to continue publishing the journal with forthcoming articles.

Teaching Unit

The statute that set up the Centre mandated it to organize courses of instruction in Islamic Studies for advanced degrees, diplomas, certificates as well as seminars of the University to meet societal needs. It is in line with the provisions of the statute that the Management Board approved the commencement of certificate and diploma programmes in Arabic and Islamic Studies from the 1983/84 session. From the inception of the two programmes to date students from different states of the federation were registered to read diploma and certificate in Da'wah, Arabic and Islamic Studies. In fact, the Centre graduated thousands of Certificate and Diploma holders. Some of them had acquired Ph.D. in Arabic/Islamic Studies.

Community Service Unit

The Community Service Unit was created in 1988 along with other units. The main objective of the unit is to render services to the immediate community of the University and beyond, which other units of the university could not offer because of the peculiarities of their works. In line with this objective, a number of programmes were initiated by the Centre for Islamic Studies under this Unit. These programmes are used to demonstrate the growth and development of the Centre:

a) National Qur'anic Recitation Competition

The National Qur'anic Recitation Competition is the most popular programme initiated by the Centre for Islamic Studies. It is one of the programmes that brings Muslims together as brothers and sisters in the service of Al-Qur'an, the last Divine Scripture.



The Competition starts at the local government level throughout the states of the Federation and culminates at the national level. Initially, three categories contested during the competition, namely: juniors (0-13 years), intermediates (14-25 years) and seniors (26 years and above) with both males and females participating. Through experience and participation at international level, the Centre streamlined the categorization of participants by the number of Hizbs (portions) for both male and female. The National Qur'anic Recitation Competition has earned the University and the nation an enviable name both in Nigeria and at the International level. In the same way it has earned for itself a selfless service for the Nigerian Muslims in promoting the study of the Glorious Qur'an.

The maiden schedule of the Competition was organized by the Centre at the city Campus of the University of Sokoto, now Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto in 1986, thereafter, the competition now rotate among the states of the Federation and Abuja.

The Programme is currently funded through hosting by state governments. Also, donations are received from government parastatals, corporate companies and individual philanthropists. The latest Competition was hosted by Yobe State in December, 2023, which was the 38th edition.



CENTRE FOR HAUSA STUDIES (CIBIYAR NAZARIN HAUSA)

Profile

The Centre for Hausa Studies (Cibiyar Nazarin Hausa) was established in October, 1983 as a research Centre which is solely devoted to the study of Hausa language and culture and its scientific and social segment. These encompass various disciplines.

Despite the existence of other research centres for liberal arts, cultures, African and Nigerian languages, (which mostly are performance and linguistically oriented), this centre in the Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, is unique and the first of its kind in the nation by the time it was established in 1983.

The main assignment of academic members of the staff are to conduct research in Hausa material and non- material cultures collect and analyze the materials, edit and compile catalogue as well as publish the end results. They also have a secondary assignment of giving support to departments that need their expertise.

Objectives of the Centre

- i. Conduct research in the material and non-material culture of Hausa such as linguistics, language, Literature, Culture, History, Philosophy, Education, Economics, Human Geography, Sociology, Science and Technology, Traditional Medicine, Ethnic relationship with non- Hausa etc.
- ii. Organize seminars and symposia and publish their proceedings
- iii. Compile catalogue of materials collected and provide information about other materials elsewhere.
- iv. Provide supplementary and specialized research materials, raw and digested data for research in Hausa to scholars, undergraduate and postgraduate students in the above mentioned disciplines
- v. Make references available for the undergraduate, diploma and certificate courses.
- vi. To assist in other functions that relate to the academic and immediate locality as well as at national and international levels.





CENTRE FOR OPEN AND DISTANCE EDUCATION (CODE)

Profile

In pursuance of its core objective of encouraging the advancement of learning and to hold out to all persons, without distinction of race, creed, sex, or political conviction, the opportunity of acquiring higher and liberal education, Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto decided to push its frontier beyond regular setting to establishing an ODL centre. The Senate at its 340th meeting, held on the 28th April, 2021 approved the establishment of the **Centre for Open and Distance Education (CODE)**. This development made Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto a dual-mode institution, providing academic programs both conventionally and through remote learning. The decision of the Senate on the matter was presented to the Governing Council of the University at 161st (Special) meeting held on the 30th April 2021 in line with Section 6 (3) of the University Act for further considerations and endorsement. After careful deliberations, the Council endorsed the establishment of the Centre. The Centre has a Governing Board empowered to formulate policies and a Management Team responsible for the implementation of its activities such as academic programs, examinations, and revenue generation.

Objectives of the Centre

The objectives of CODE are derived from the overall objectives of the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto to be achieved through distance education. Specifically, CODE was established with the objectives to:

- i. provide access to university education to individuals who want to pursue university education through the ODL option;
- ii. provide opportunities to combine study with other activities of life;
- iii. contribute to the development of middle and high-level manpower requirements in both the public and private sectors; and

The Centre also engages facilitators to manage learning both online and offline by providing course guide, facilitate engagement in learning as well as conduct and mark examinations.

Activities of the Centre

The main activity of the Centre is to provide distance learning opportunities to students who chose to pursue their academic career from the comfort of their homes and working environments without inhibition. Therefore, as soon as the Centre was established, it engaged the National Universities Commission (NUC), the regulating body of university education in Nigeria, to secure approval to commence academic activities. After rigorous accreditation and validation processes, the Centre was granted permission to run BNSc Nursing programme starting from 2023 / 2024 academic session. Consequently, the Centre has made its first admission into BNSc Nursing and has commenced lectures.

Equipment and Facilities

Centre for Open and Distance Education is domiciled at the Prometric Centre. It has state-of-the-art-facilities that will drive delivery synchronous and asynchronous learning. Prometric Centre has 200 computers fitted for Computer Based Test (CBT), internet facilities, smart boards, standby generating sets, water supply system and solar and battery-powered inverters that support the server room.

The Future of the Centre

The Centre has developed a 5-year development plan that will guide the expansion of the Centre's activities. The plan is based on the desire to grow the Centre within reasonable period to an enviable height that will afford it the opportunity to live to its visions as well as realising the main objectives the Centre was created to achieve. The plan also envisages broadening and deepening the sources of internally generated revenue as well as optimizing and efficiently utilize available funds to promote both academic and facility expansion. In this regard, the plan addresses the key areas of the operation of the Centre with a view to projecting the envisaged developments and how each will contribute to the overall growth of the Centre

Profile

At the inception of the University in October, 1977, the Library was temporarily housed in a small building which had the capacity of accommodating only 50 readers at a time. Later, it was expanded into three wings in the 1979/1980 Academic Session. This made it possible for the Library to provide additional spaces not only for reading but also for the expanding collection, reference services and staff offices, including office of the University Librarian.

The movement of six faculties from the City Campus to the Main Campus in the 1981/1982 session had also necessitated the transfer of the Main Library along with these faculties. In the absence of any library structure at the Main Campus, a multipurpose large hall (initially meant to serve as auditorium) was converted into a temporary Central Library. The large hall had a usable area of 1.165m2 and the capacity to house about 75,000 volumes of books and 840 periodical titles and accommodate 242 readers at a time. However, due to rapid expansion of the collection and rising staff and students' population over the years, an ultra-modern two-storey central library complex was constructed and officially opened for use on 9th November, 2009. The Library is officially named Abdullahi Fodiyo Library Complex. Ever since, the Library has continued to grow and developed into a complex system in terms of branches, collection, staffing, facilities, services and operations as discussed below.

The Main Library and Its Branches

The Abdullahi Fodiyo Library Complex comprises the Main Library and twenty-one branch libraries, which were created specifically to promote the teaching, learning, research and community service activities of the various faculties, departments, units and research centres of the University. The Main Library consists of the following major sections and facilities, with each one of them serving specific functions aimed at achieving the overall objectives of the Library and the University, as follows:

In addition to these, there is deliberate plan for the establishment of departmental resource rooms, so as to decongest both the Main Library and the faculty libraries and



also facilitate closer access to available learning resources by staff and students at the departmental levels.

Collection Development

Over the years, the collection of the Library has steadily grown from less than 20,000 volumes at the initial stage to over 1,600,000 presently. The collection consists of books, periodicals, undergraduate projects, theses/dissertations, electronic resources/databases, archives and special collections, publications of government and non-governmental organizations, and numerous other information resources both in print and electronic formats.

In particular, the archives and special collections started from 2008-2009 when the University offered a sabbatical appointment to Alhaji Inuwa Dikko, the former University Librarian, Ahmadu Bello University Zaria. It was a special project to development, discovery and collection of materials relating to Northern Nigeria, comprising archives, manuscripts and historical records dating back to pre-colonial periods. The records specially deal with the historical antecedents of the defunct Northern Provinces of Nigeria, such as colonial administration and Native Authority (NA), traditional institutions, education, religion, social life, economy, technology, agriculture etc. The special collection on the other hand comprises contemporary but rare books and books and classic works, which are out-of-print, scarce or hardly in circulation but form a basic reading and research material for a discipline or course of study. The collection also includes numerous seminar, conference and workshop proceedings. Others include works on the Sokoto Caliphate, Nigeriana, notable biographies and autobiographies of eminent personalities in Nigeria, Africa and other parts of the world.

ICT Infrastructure and Virtual Library Project

As part of the efforts of the University to enhance teaching, learning and research using modern technologies, the ICT Section of the Library was created and equipped with the state-of-the-art electronic facilities and resources. The facilities include, among others, internet connectivity and services, more than 550 computer systems, Solar Inverter Power Backup, Industrial UPS, Scanners, Printers, Webcams, External hard disks, IP phones, Flash drives and CD-ROMs, etc.

Another significant development in ICT is the digitization project. After the expiration of the World Bank STEP-B project, the University handed over the digitization work to the Library for continuation. Consequently, KOHA Integrated Library Software and Institutional Repository Software (IRS) such as DSpace and Green Stone were deployed. Furthermore, nine (9) Library staff were trained on digital project management techniques which enable them to, among other things, design digitization workflow, scan with optical character recognition (OCR) and assign metadata for proper upload of documents. Shortly after the training, the library started collecting scholarly works and publications from interested members of academic staff of the University for digitization, as part of the local contents of the virtual library (VL) and institutional repository. The success recorded so far in the digitization work in the Library is summarized below



- 1. All e-resources downloaded from the databases subscribed by the University were uploaded to the E-Library Portal.
- About 1000 postgraduate theses and dissertations are now accessible on the library's OER.
- 3. E-Books, theses and dissertations on CDs available in the Library were processed and arranged in the digitization room for off-line access by interested users.

Available Electronic/Digital Resources

In terms of electronic/digital resources, the Library has numerous open access books and journals that were compiled for use by members of the University Community. In addition, the University has subscribed to the Elsevier Science Direct from 2011to date. The database is one of the world's leading scientific electronic databases that provides full-text access to over 2,500 journals and more than 33,000 e-books covering 23 subject areas, plus free access to over 11,000 journal titles from 2007-2011. Ebcohost database was also subscribed by the University.

Another important database of immense research value available in the Library is the Essential Electronic Agricultural Library (TEEAL). In 2014, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, in collaboration with TEEAL Project of Cornell University in the United States of America, donated to the University a based set of the database worth \$75,000. TEEAL is a full-text digital library which provides access to over 200 international and peer-reviewed journals spanning a wide variety of subjects related to sustainable agricultural development, including: Agricultural Science, Engineering, Plant and Soil Sciences, Animal Science/ Livestock Production, Economics, Aquaculture/ Aqua Science, Crop Science, Human Medicine, Veterinary Medicine, Microbiology and Applied Microbiology, Biotechnology, Fisheries, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Phytopathology, Plant Breeding and Plant Physiology, Social Sciences, Food Science, etc (TEEAL, 2010).

In addition, the Library has also registered with HINARI for full-text access to over 15,000 journals and 47,000 e-books covering Medicine, Nursing other related health sciences and social sciences. It also includes many databases, indexes and reference books, as well as journals in several languages (HINARI, 2016). Similarly, the Library registered with JSTOR so as to facilitate access to millions of full-text peer-reviewed journal titles. JSTOR is a fast growing digital library of peer reviewed academic journals, books, and primary sources covering wide range of subject areas. Moreover, there are other numerous open access electronic resources available in the Library for the enhancement of teaching, learning and research in the University. To further enrich the digital collection of the Library, efforts are being made to renew our subscribe to Lexis Nexis, EduDonor Index, Oakleaf Global Book-in-Print, Oxford Online, HeinOnline, HEPSEU Database, and numerous other e-resources recommended by faculties and departments etc.

Staffing, Training and Development

Presently, the number of staff has risen to 145, 84 and 61 senior/junior respectively). It is worth noting that most of these staff have benefitted from the University's study fellowship for various study programmes as indicated below:

- 1. Academic Librarians 4 members of staff have obtained Ph.D while 3 are pursuing the programme. Also, 7 members of staff obtained MLIS.
- 2. Para-Professional Staff -. 12 Library Officers have obtained BLIS while 21 are in various levels of the programme.
- 3. Library Assistants 6 members of staff have obtained DLIS while 3 are pursing the Diploma programme.



Likewise, a considerable number of the Library staff were sponsored by the University for relevant training programmes, seminars, conferences and workshops organized by Library and Information professional associations and other organizations/ bodies like the Nigerian Library Association (NLA) and its various sections. Librarians Registration Council of Nigeria (LRCN), Committee of University Librarians of Nigerian Universities (CULNU), National Information and Technology Development Agency (NITDA), Council of Legal Education (Law Librarians' Annual Workshop), Industrial Training Fund (ITF), Academic and Research Libraries, Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) and a host of other capacity building programmes conducted across the country.

Profile

VETERINARY TEACHING HOSPITAL

Profile

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH) is an independent but integral part of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, of the Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, established in 1992. The Hospital is made up of Large Animal, Small Animal and Avian Clinics, Records, Pharmacy, Surgery, Ultrasound and Radiographic units. The services of these clinics are facilitated in conjunction with the Staff of the Faculty, academics and non-academics who offered their services to the VTH as clinicians and technologists respectively across different cadres. Similarly, the Hospital maintains an outstation clinic located at Achida for effective disease surveillance, rural community and rural clinical services for Veterinary Medical Students.

The VTH was approved by the College of Veterinary Surgeons of Nigeria (CVSN) as Clinical Training and Supervisory Centres for Sokoto, Kebbi and Zamfara fellows of the College (CVSN). Recently the VTH had approval as one of the Study Centres of the College. The Faculties and Specialties approved are: Surgery Faculty (Small Animal Surgery and Theriogenology), Public Health and Preventive Medicine (Public Health and Preventive Medicine), Medicine Faculty (Small Animal Medicine, & Avian Medicine).

Function

The primary function of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH) is to serve as a centre of excellence for the provision of high-quality Veterinary services and training of Veterinary Doctors in their final clinical years. The Hospital also accepts referral of clinical cases and runs consultancy and ambulatory services to the public.

The Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH) in conjunction with the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Consultancy Services, runs a 2-year Diploma programme in Animal Health and Production (DAHP) for servicing field workers, which also serve as a pre-degree programme.



VETERINARY TEACHING HOSPITAL

In conjunction with the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, the Veterinary Teaching Hospital (VTH) coordinates clinical conferences and ward rounds for Veterinary Medical Students on weekly basis and provides facilities for conducting research for both undergraduate and postgraduate students.

There are ambulatory services to Fulani Herdsmen, Institutional Farms, and Livestock farmers.

Similarly, the Public Health Clinicians visit the Abattoir regularly to perform meat inspection to ensure that animals slaughtered are fit for human consumption.

SCHOOL OF BASIC AND ADVANCED STUDIES

Profile

The School of Basic and Advanced Studies (SOBAS), formerly known as the School of Matriculation Studies (SMS) is the Usmanu Danfodiyo University's School for remedial/pre-degree studies. The School was established in 1995 to serve as a hub for the intensive preparative training of prospective candidates for admission into various degree programmes of the University.

The School has its origin in the early 1970s as a pre-degree programme under the Faculty of Science, and then later under the Division of General Studies. The School was restructured into its current form in 1995. Since its establishment, the School has been able to successfully feed several thousand students into various degree programmes of the University. Products of the School are therefore found in various fields of specialisation contributing their quota both within and outside the country.

In October 2022, the School was repositioned to continue to address the increasing needs of its catchment area communities for preparation of candidates to gain admission into the University, thus the name was changed to School of Basic and Advanced Studies (SOBAS). This is in order for the School to accommodate more programmes that will open wider opportunities for candidates to acquire higher qualifications and or join the University.

Apart from Matriculation and Remedial Programmes, UTME (JAMB) Coaching/Training and Extramural Classes are also available for candidates who wish to be trained on how to successfully write and pass SSCE and computer – based JAMB examination.

Structures/Facilities

The School resides in its permanent structure within the premises of Sahara Hostel, opposite the City Campus of the University. The School has four classes, each with a capacity of about 250 students and ETF lecture hall (located in the City Campus) with a capacity of 500 students. The School's administrative Block houses the Director's office, Examination Officer's office, Administrative Secretary's office, Staff Room and the old laboratory of the School. The School also has four Science laboratories: 2 for Chemistry and 1 each for Biology and Physics. There is also a dedicated library stocked with books and other learning materials accessible to registered students of the School. The library, however, is under the administrative control of the University Librarian rather than the School's Director.



SCHOOL OF BASIC AND ADVANCED STUDIES

The classes have separate toilet facilities for female and male students. There is also a mosque under the control of the School for female Muslim students. The Muslim male students use the Sahara mosque which is under the control of the Student Affairs Division through the City Campus MSS.

The University Management had, in October 2022, approved the establishment of IJMB programme in SOBAS to serve the dual purpose of giving candidates the associated qualifications and facilitates their direct entry admission into the University and other institutions. To that effect, additional two (2) classes, each of 150 capacity has been handed over to the School by the University Authority.

Admission

The admission is through the purchase of a form online by Students. Such students must have 5 credits in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and English language. The Admission is done by a central committee chaired by the Deputy Vice Chancellor Academics. Other members of the committee are: The Registrar, Director of the School of Matriculation studies, Director Academic planning, Admissions officer of the University and Examination officer of the School of Basic and Advanced studies. Only students with five credits at WAEC/NECO/NABTEB are qualified for admission into the Matriculation Programme.

Academics

Currently, students at the School offer five compulsory subjects including Biology, Chemistry, Mathematic, Physics, and English Language. The students are examined during and at the end of the 9 months intensive programme. All students are also required to register and sit for JAMB/UTME. Students are also trained and coached on how to write and pass computer – based UTME (JAMB) Examination.

Staffing

The School has four administrative Staff consisting of the Director, Examinations Officer, Administrative Secretary and Finance Officer. The academic staff of the School consists of 45 teachers (9 Staff per subject: 1 for each Class) that cater for lectures and 18 laboratory technologists (6 Staff per subject) that take care of practical sessions. The Staff are engaged based on their qualifications and experience on part-time and are paid on pro rata basis by the School.

The School has a total of 20 non-academic Staff consisting of 1 secretary, 1 driver, 4 laboratory assistants, 1 laboratory supervisor and 12 casual Staff.

Profile

The Academic Planning Unit was first established in the University in 1983/1984 academic session as a statistical development office. In 1990/1991 session, the name was changed to Planning and Monitoring Unit of the University; and in 1993, it was renamed Academic Planning Office. In 1994, as a result of reforms by the National Universities Commission (NUC), the office became a distinct Unit under the Office of the Vice Chancellor. The Unit came into being by the joint decision of the National Universities Commission (NUC) and the Committee of Vice Chancellors (CVC) that a Directorate of Academic Planning should be set up in all Nigerian universities and should be headed by a Director.

The Academic Planning Unit is an integral part of the Vice Chancellor's Office charged with the responsibilities of providing the required guidance for the orderly and balanced academic development of the University in the performance of its functions of teaching, research and community services. The Unit performs planning and quality assurance functions and ensures compliance with the NUC's Benchmark Minimum Academic Standards (BMAS) and University Senate's academic requirements. It therefore enhances efficiency in teaching, learning and research in the University as well as the dissemination and publication of relevant information.

Functions

The key functions of the Academic Planning Unit include:

- 1) Planning
 - a) Preparation of University annual recurrent budget
 - b) Projection of students' enrolment figures, corresponding staff strength and distribution of students according to state of origin and sex for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.
 - c) Computation of full-time equivalent (FTE) for all programmes.



- d) Preparation of University calendar for stable academic delivery.
- e) Initiating the review of curriculum in line with trends in the academic world as well as working with Faculties to prepare, review and monitor their academic plans and identify areas for potential development.

2) Quality Assurance

The Unit promotes quality of teaching, learning and research through periodic evaluation of academic activities in the University in the following ways:

- a) Coordinating the preparation of Academic Brief and guiding units of the University on the operations of the Academic Brief.
- b) Supplying periodic analysis of performance evaluation of academic programmes
- c) Conducting analysis of students' enrolment figures and ensuring compliance with guidelines such as admission quota, teacher/student ratio and science/arts ratio.
- d) Feasibility studies for the establishment of new academic programme(s)
- e) Use of data collected for making projections and advising the University as appropriate

3) Publications and Statistics

The Unit is responsible for the coordination and collation of information to NUC for national planning. It is responsible for:

- a) Maintaining data base on students and staff statistics for use in planning, budgeting, and other requirements
- b) Periodic statistics to bodies like Federal Ministry of Education and National Manpower Board; as well as statistics output to individual researchers on demand.
- c) Periodic update and analyzing data from relevant University bodies for the internal evaluation of performance status of the University on all the NUC approved funding parameters and other guidelines
- d) Publication of University records, statistics and research reports
- e) Documenting and storing information on academic programmes of the University as well as student academic and personal records.

4) Liaison

The Unit liaise academic matters between the University, on one hand; and the regulatory body, the NUC, and professional bodies, on the other.

5) Strategic Plan

The Unit participates in the coordination of all the activities involved in the production of the University Strategic Plan.

Establishment of New Undergraduate Academic Programmes

The National Universities Commission (NUC) undertook resource verification visit of the proposed (new) undergraduate and postgraduate academic programmes in October, 2023. The purpose was to assess the human and material resources available for their establishment. In furtherance to these, the NUC has approved the

Profile

Historically, the Student Affairs Division was operating under the office of the Registrar; however, in 1991 it was brought under the office of the Vice-Chancellor and headed by a Dean.

The Division is responsible for the general well-being and personal and professional development of students on the campuses; as well as ensuring students discipline.

In this regard, the Student Affairs Office attends to matters pertaining to Students' Union, associations, social clubs and societies. The division facilitates their registrations and regular monitoring of their day to day activities in the Campus. Importantly, in liaison with National Youth Service Corp, the office handles graduate students' mobilization into the National youth Service Scheme (NYSC).

The Guidance and Counselling Unit offers counselling services to students particularly as it affects their academic career. This is done by:

- 1) Developing students' skills for better self-understanding
- 2) Equipping students with skills for self-improvement both at school and in later in life
- 3) Assisting students in adjusting to the life and culture of the University and that of the host community
- 4) In addition, the Unit organizes a number of programs aimed at developing full students' potentials and problem-solving techniques to make them become useful members of the society.

Furthermore, Federal and states scholarships boards liaise with the Division for the purpose of disbursement of scholarships and bursary awards to deserving students. More so, the Division facilitates access to scholarships offered by companies, individuals, donor agencies and organizations to deserving students.

Profile

The Directorate of Registration and Examinations was established on the 13th of August 2007 as Directorate of Examination by the then Vice Chancellor, Professor Tijjani Muhammad Bande (GCFR). It was established as a result of concerns of the University Senate of the need to facilitate timely processing of examination results. The Directorate has a Director who works closely with the relevant Departments and Units of the University and report directly to the Vice Chancellor on issues related to students' registration and examinations. The pioneer Director of the Directorate was Late Prof Usman Abubakar (May his soul rest in peace) of the Department of Biological Sciences. Under his stewardship, the Directorate had recorded tremendous success in the conduct of Post-UTME examination and the processing of students' results. This prompted the Senate of the University to expand the scope and mandate of the Directorate to include registration of new and returning students of the University. In this regard, the Directorate's name was changed to the Directorate of Registration and Examinations. From inception to date, the Directorate has five Directors as follows:

Acting Dean of Faculty of Social Sciences among others. To successfully carry out its mandate, the Directorate leverage on I.T support staff from the University MIS unit, while administrative staff were posted to the Directorate by the University Registrar for its smooth operation.

The Directorate has been involved in the following activities:

- 1) Processing of students results on behalf the University Senate
- 2) Conducting of Senate Standing Committee on Examination meetings to consider and recommend results for the Senate approval
- 3) Facilitating correction of results for students cleared for graduation
- 4) Ensuring proper screening of all newly admitted students
- 5) Arranging speedy confirmation of newly admitted students
- 6) Facilitating conduct of registration for both fresh and returning students
- 7) Presentation of summary of results to the Senate for award of Degrees
- 8) Ensuring speedy creation of accurate personal accounts using the University **ICT** facilities
- 9) Creating enabling environment to ease payments of all fees by both fresh and returning students

Registration of Students

One of the major objectives of the Directorate is to ensure hitch-free registration exercise and confirmation of students admitted into the University. The Directorate has in recent years introduced innovation and modified various I.T tools and components of registration exercise to be in line with the global best practices. Following this development, students of the University can access the University and initiate their registration process anywhere across the world. As part of I.T innovation in the university, the University Management has established an ICT centre where students are provided with free internet services to register and generate course and payment registration forms. This has greatly reduced difficulties being faced by students during registration exercise. Given this laudable development, the Directorate has the 2022/2023 academic session registered and confirmed 4676 undergraduate students and 1233 Post-graduate students. The registration and confirmation of students for the 2023/2024 academic session for both undergraduate and postgraduate programmes is on-going along with that of the returning students. As the University grows, its management has been supporting the Directorate to undertake I.T reforms to improve quality and standards of students' registration, examination processing and safety.

Processing of Students Results

Acquisition of information and communication technology tools has gradually transformed every aspect of examination administration across high institutions of learning. It is in this regard that the Directorate has, in 2011 successfully facilitated migration of undergraduate result processing from the Student Academic Personal Information System (SAPIS) to the Educational Enterprises Resource Personal System (EduERP). The EduERp tool provides students with the opportunity to access and view their examination records from their comfort zones. It has also strengthened the university examination results platform, improved and ensured timely processing

of students results. In addition, EduERP has made examination results analysis easy for all stakeholders in the University. The University is continuously making efforts to improve its I.T facilities for the overall benefits of its staff and students. UDUS Research Management System

The establishment of the Research Management System by the Directorate has enhanced the efficiency of the processes involved in collecting, submitting, and processing research grant applications, as well as monitoring university research data. This system plays an important role in monitoring and managing research grants and awards, contributing significantly to the University's academic reputation. To facilitate these processes, the Directorate has introduced a dedicated UDUS-linked website at https://research.udusok.edu.ng/. This website serves as a valuable resource for researchers and scholars, offering support from research administrators.

Through the website, researchers benefit from self-service features enabled by the Research Management System. This functionality allows them to access information on various research grants within the university, identify potential funding opportunities, and seamlessly submit their IBR grant applications. Additionally, the website offers a self-service option for grant holders through the Research Grant Monitoring Portal, enabling them to monitor and manage their research grants and awards within the University.

Research Funding

The year 2023 was characterised by the presence of significant volatility in national research funding with considerably heightened awareness at the institutional level. The University took proactive measures to ensure that researchers at UDUS receive funding to address significant challenges within the community. The Directorate played a key role in providing support services, promoting, and encouraging researchers to ensure successful grant applications. Consequently, the University secured funding from two major calls, namely the Institutional Research-Based (IBR) and the National Research Fund (NRF), both provided by TETfund. The success can be attributed to the aggressive awareness and training programs coordinated by the Directorate for research staff. These initiatives have played a significant role in empowering University researchers to explore new research areas aligned with local, regional, and national priorities, ensuring the sustainability and development of existing and emerging research strengths.

In the year 2023, the Directorate demonstrated remarkable success by attracting a total funding of \$\frac{1}{12}463,707,696.89, a notable increase compared to the ₩411,644,121.50 awarded in 2022. The year 2023 has witnessed a substantial growth of over 11% in research grants compared to the preceding year (2022), as illustrated in Figure 1. A detailed breakdown of the research grants is provided in the subsequent sections 4.1 and 4.2.




Figure 3: Total research grants awarded to UDUS researchers in the year 2022 and 2023.

Institutional Research Based (IBR)

The Institutional Research Grant (IBR) offers a maximum funding of ₩2,000,000.00 per research project, aiming to encourage initial investigations within academic circles in public tertiary institutions in Nigeria. In the year 2023, there has been a significant



rise in IBR grants, witnessing an increase of approximately 31% compared to the preceding year (2022), as illustrated in Figure 2.




Figure 4: IBR grants awarded to UDUS researchers in the year 2022 and 2023.

National Research Fund (NRF)

The National Research Fund (NRF) serves as a strategic initiative by the Nigerian government aimed at amplifying research activities within the public tertiary institutions. Its primary objective is to address the crucial demand for impactful research that contributes substantially to national development. The NRF is specifically structured to nurture research and innovation throughout Nigerian universities and other tertiary institutions. By offering funding support, the funds allocated by the NRF provide a maximum amount of \$\frac{1}{2}50,000,000.00 per research project, aiming to advance excellence in research and encourage the undertaking of high-quality projects. Also, the year 2023 has witnessed a substantial increase in NRF grants, surpassing the figures from the preceding year (2022) by more than 9%, as illustrated in Figure 3.




Figure 5: NRF grants awarded to UDUS researchers in the year 2022 and 2023.



Bulletin of Directorate of Research, Innovation and Development

The Directorate of Research, Innovation and Development had established first, a Quarterly Bulletin in March, 2023 which later metamorphosed into a monthly Bulletin in August 2023 with an additional mandate of disseminating information on funding opportunities. Three Quarterly editions had been produced from January to August, 2023 and Four monthly editions from September to December, 2023. The Bulletin is being circulated through the University Website and various social media platforms.

Advanced Digital Empowerment Programme for Tertiary Institutions (ADEPTI)

The Digital Bridge Institute Abuja had facilitated the training of the Usmanu Danfodiyo University staff under the institute's Advanced Digital Empowerment Programme for Tertiary Institutions (ADEPTI). The training took place in the University from Monday 19th to Friday 23rd June, 2023 in 2 (Modules) areas.

Academic Partnership with Sudan International University (SIU)

The Sudan International University, (SIU) Khartoum initiated a process for an Academic partnership with Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto (UDUS) as a Teaching Institution under the National Universities Commission's Transnational Education (TNE) programme on 9th June, 2023. The Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto responded in the affirmative indicating willingness for the partnership. After series of meetings and interactions between UDUS and SIU, a MoU was drafted and signed by both SIU and UDUS. Furthermore, the University Senate at its 354th Meeting approved the collaboration with Sudan International University. Similarly, UDUS a request of No-Objection made to the NUC in line with the NUC TNE requirements. The programme formally started on 18th December, 2023 with the graduating students of the MBBS programme of SIU. The decision by SIU to request for the partnership was exacerbated by the political crises in Sudan.

UDUS-J Manager

In order to facilitate management of academic journals published within the University, the University funded the development of UDUS-J Management Platform, that is envisaged to host not only journals published in the University, but also those other scholarly journals published by sister institutions within the country and beyond.

- 10) preparing payment of stages, I & II of the Consultancy services (Pre-contract stage)

- 3) The Secretary, Tenders Board (TB)



Profile

The Department was established in June 1976. It was one of the pioneer service departments in the University. The first head of the Department was Dr AKH Mustafa, a Sudanese who was appointed as a Medical Officer together with three nurses, three clinic assistants and one health inspector; these were the pioneer staff of the Department. In 1979 a Senior Medical Officer (Dr SA Halima) was employed and made the officer in-charge of the department, he worked with Dr Mustafa and a couple of other staff at the City Campus. The structure at the City Campus, which housed the initial clinic, is still being maintained as an annex of the department. With the movement of the University to the permanent site, the Clinic was moved to a temporary structure at a wing of the Female Students' hostel. In 1984, Dr Halima left the services of the University and Dr AM Ahmad was appointed as the acting Director of the Department. With establishment of the Clinic at the Permanent site, the services at the city campus became skeletal; while the clinic at the permanent site began to operate 16 hours per day seven days a week, that of the City Campus became only eight hours per day, five days a week. Apparently, the need to create a more conducive space to cope with rising demand of its services as the institution's population grew. necessitated the movement of the clinic from the female students' hostel to project supervision office adjacent to the Faculty of Science in 1996. That structure provided the opportunity for the department to become a full-fledged Primary Care Centre, with 15 beds, small laboratory and a mini theatre. The clinic at the Permanent Site began to operate 24 hours a day, 7 day a week. Dr Toury, Dr HO Issa and Dr Efajeku acted as Directors at various times between 1986 and 1996. Dr MIL Shehu was appointed the first substantive Director of the Department in 1996. He served for 6 years and Dr Ibraheem Omar was appointed as acting Director in 2003. The rising demand of Health care services by ever increasing population of staff and students of the University was a great cause of concern for the University Management at that time, therefore several attempts were made to expand the building and provide other services.

Administrative Structure

The Directorate of Health Services currently comprises seven (7) Departments and Three (3) Units. The departments are:

1) Clinical Services



- 2) Public Health
- 3) Nursing
- 4) Pharmacy
- 5) Laboratory
- 6) Health Information Management and
- 7) Administration

The Units are:

- 1) Maternal and Child Health Unit
- 2) The Wards and
- 3) The Theatre

These departments are not budgetary departments in the University; it was only arranged for ease of administration. The clinical services department is responsible for coordinating the provision of medical care in the two clinics. The Nursing Department fosters and participates in an interdisciplinary health care environment, supporting collegial relationships among nurses and other health care providers for the purpose of achieving the goal of clinically integrated care. The Public Health Unit provides sanitation services on the three campuses of the University. Pharmacy, Laboratory and Health Information Management Departments provide their respective services in the two clinics. The Maternal and Child Health Unit handles services that are related to mother and child such as ante natal care, routine immunization, family planning, and Labour room duties.

Services

The Department provides medical services for staff and students. In 1976 when the department was established, the services provided were strictly out-patient services for preventive medicine and common illnesses. In 1996 when the clinic moved to the Project Office adjacent to Faculty of Sciences, in-patient services were established. Currently the clinic is a full-fledged secondary health care facility with fifty beds, radiology (X- ray and Ultrasound) blood banking and facility for Surgeries and basic obstetric services. The Centre is accredited with the National Health Insurance Scheme for both primary and secondary services. In addition to the on-site family physicians (generalists) care, we provide a specialized mental health service through visiting Consultant Psychiatrist. There is also a specialized hypertension and Diabetics clinics on Thursdays. The theatre unit is gradually coming of age, from November 2014 to date; about 120 surgical operations (both minor and major surgeries) have been conducted. In order to address increasing incidence of health related social problems among our students. We established an extramural counselling centre at the Human Development Centre (IBB Centre) that provides counselling services for reproductive health, particularly, confidential HIV testing, counselling and monitoring, substance abuse and nutrition counselling. Laboratory services have developed from just 7 available tests in 1976 to about 56 different tests in 2016 including an automated blood analysis and lipid profiling.

The pharmacy department is accredited by the NHIS as a secondary care facility. In addition to normal delivery services at the MCH, we conduct a robust family planning



clinic that provides all methods of family planning. Our immunization services too are sturdy as evidenced by the level of utilization. Part of our responsibility is to assist the various Deans of Faculties to establish the authenticity of students claim of ill health, therefore if a student is, for reason of ill health unable to complete his/her academic responsibilities, he/she is expected to apply for concession to his/her Dean, and the Dean will in turn send the claim for authentication. In the event the student attended the University Clinic during the period of ill health, the Department will inform the Dean of the student's Faculty for excuse. In addition to all these the Department conduct pre-employment medical screening for staff of the University. We also conduct pre-admission medical screening for all students. Currently, the clinic at Permanent Site opens 24hrs a day 7days a week, however routine clinical services are available to only between the hours of 8:00am and 9:00pm, beyond that, only emergency cases are attended too. The clinic at the City Campus operates only 8hrs a day 5 days a week.

Staff Profile

Currently, there are sixty-six (66) senior staff in the department, comprising,

- a) 6 full time Medical doctors (including the Director)
- b) 36 Registered Nurses
- c) 5 Laboratory technicians
- d) 7 Pharmacy technicians
- e) 4 Medical Record Officers
- f) 2 Public health officers
- g) 2 Administrative officers
- h) 2 Senior Drivers and
- i) 1 Store Officer

The 6 medical officers are further supported by Five (5) other locum doctors. One of the doctors is currently on study leave. The Director holds an MB Bch from the University of Jos and an MPH from Usmanu Danfodiyo University. He is also a Diplomate of the Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria in the Faculty of Family Medicine.

There are 39 junior staff in the department, comprising

- a) 2 Community Health Extension Workers
- b) 1 Pharmacy assistant
- c) 6 Record clerks
- d) 7 Drivers
- e) 4 Administrative clerks and
- f) 19 cleaners

The current staff profile indicates that the department has developed from a humble beginning of seven staff in 1976 to about 100 staff, in 40 years.

Profile

Presently, the three campuses of the University are divided into the following sectors (referred to as **Security Zones**) as follows:

- 1) Academic Core Area
- 2) Area IW
- 3) Students Hostel
- 4) Law Faculty/Works Department
- 5) Social Science/Management Science Faculties
- 6) Agric Faculty/Veterinary Complex
- 7) Runjin Sambo Staff Quarters
- 8) College of Health Sciences (CHS)
- 9) City Campus Complex
- 10) Centre for Agriculture and Pastoral Research (Dabagi).

Equipment

During the year under review, about three hundred pairs of security uniforms and kits were issued to two (2) hundred security personnel. Also, three (3) brand new motorcycles and ten (10) bicycles and thirty (30) rechargeable lamps were issued for effective and efficient day/night security patrol coverage the campuses.

Close circuit Television (CCTV)

This is a security television system installed at strategic locations, including the main gates and the students' hostel for surveillance. The cameras are internet enabled with the control center at the CSO's Office for monitoring on 24/7 basis.

Fire Fighting Equipment

There is a serious need for the Division to have at least one (1) fire fighting vehicle as the nearest Fire Fighting outfit is the Sokoto State Fire Service, which is located at about 15km from the University.

Body/Vehicle Scanners

The under mentioned Equipment were procured for the Division and deployed accordingly at the University Gates and the body Scanners are used during conferences and at Examination venues.

Routine Patrol Duties

The Division conducts daily routine (Night/Day) Patrol duties. This enables the security staff to check and report on area/bit visited and take measures, if any.

Vehicles/Motorcycles Parks

The Students Union constructed three (3) pilot motorcycle parks located within the Main Campus. The initiative considerably has reduced the rampant cases of motorcycle thefts. However, the Management is required to ensure that all motorcycles must be parked at the designated parking lot henceforth.

Vehicles parks for both staff, students and visitors should also be prioritized and that all vehicles should be parked at a designated area to be provided by the Management.

Appointments and recruitment exercise in the University was last conducted in 2018/2019. Despite the need, the University could not make any recruitment to fill existing vacancies for obvious directives on the embargo placed on recruitment by the Federal Government. However, with the lifting of the embargo via the decision of the Federal Executive Council at its EC(2023) 23rd Meeting held on Wednesday, 13th December, 2023, the University has begun preparation for the exercise as it has placed an Internal and External advertisement in two national dailies for filling of vacancies in six (6) departments that are identified to have pressing and immediate needs.

However, the University was constrained, during the period under review, to fill some vacancies by employing the services of experienced/retired hands on contract appointments. Other temporary appointments such as visiting and sabbatical, locum and adjourn/part time were also made all as interim measures aimed at mitigating the impact of inadequate manpower across departments vis-a-vis the continuous expansion of the University. Profile

The Bursary Department is headed by the Bursar supported by Deputy Bursars who are heads of Divisions in the Bursary Department. They are also assisted by other staff of the Department in the discharge of the financial functions of the Department.

Role Of The Bursary Department

The Bursary Department is charged with the responsibility of maintaining adequate records of all the Revenue and Expenditure of the University in such an adequate manner as to generate accurate and timely financial information for Management to aid informed decision. The Department is required to give an annual account of the financial position of the University to the Governing Council and other users of the financial statements, through the preparation of Annual Audited Accounts.

Divisions Of Bursary Department

For effective discharge of its responsibility and administrative convenience, the Bursary Department is divided into seven divisions. The Divisions are headed by Deputy Bursars who report directly to the Bursar. The Divisions are;

Office of the Bursar--- The division is responsible for staff related matters such as promotion, annual leave, staff training and general administration of the Bursary Department.

Special Funds---This Division is in charge of receipts and disbursement of funds received from Tetfund for staff Training, Research and capital projects, as well as Presidential Needs Assessment grants and other specially designed funds.

Final Accounts and Reports. It is the responsibility of this division to prepare the annual accounts of the University and other reports as may be required by the Bursar and external users

Treasury --is in charge of staff emoluments and other salary related matters. To do this, the Division is in close contact with IPPIS.

Budget Control and Management—except for recent creation of the Directorate of Budget and Statistics, the role of this division is to prepare the University's annual Budgets, both recurrent and capital and control the expenditure to be in line with the budget.



Central Admin Complex--- Expenditures of both Academic and Administrative complexes in the University are managed by this division of the Bursary Department **Purchases and Supply -----**All goods purchased for the University are received by the purchases and Supply Division, on request; it issues the goods to user Departments. The Division maintains adequate records of receipts and issues and at the end of the year, it carries out a stock taking of items not yet issued for inclusion in the audited accounts.

Budget and Budgetary Apropriations

The University prepares both the capital and recurrent budget estimates on annual basis. The Budgets represent the financial needs of the University for the year and submits same to the budget office. Establishment: The University Press Ltd., now named UDUS Press Ltd. was established in October 1981 with responsibility of printing of all security documents of the University and the public at large.

Ownership: UDUS Press Ltd. Is owned by the Usmanu Danfodiyo University Sokoto.

Management: The UDUS Press Ltd. is managed by the University Press Management Committee (hereafter referred to as Press Management Board Committee). The Board was appointed by the Vice Chancellor on 3rd January, 2020 for a period of two years which was renewed on 3rd January 2023 for another period of two years. The committee is currently headed Prof. S. U. Musa as Chairman with membership from Academia, Registry and Bursary.

The management committee is responsible for overseeing the printing of stationaries, official reports, circulars, publishing research materials and providing printing services to the University and general public.

The committee also oversees all the affairs of the Press Ltd, regarding payment of staff salary, maintenance and other activities.

The University Press Ltd. has 5 units which include:

- i. Computer/Graphic Section
- ii. Operating Section
- iii. Finishing and Binding Section
- iv. Accounting Section
- v. Planning Section (Office of the Manager)

Academic Publishing Centre (APC) North Western Zone

APC North western zone situated at UDUS is one of the Academic Publishing Centers established by Tetfund to carry out printing and publishing activities as well as commissioning book writing projects of the zone and beyond. It was handed over to Usmanu Danfodiyo University in September 2023.

The center has modern machines that can print full color separation, publish books, journals, magazines, memos, banners etc.

Technical Advisory Committee

The University Management appointed a technical advisory committee with a coordinator for the APC to offer technical guidance in running the center.

Activities of the University Press/APC

Since the appointment of the current management committee, the following activities were carried out:

- 1. Publishing and printing of books, journals, reports, stationery for the university and beyond.
- 2. The APC under the stewardship of the Press Management Committee carried out the publication of ten (10) book titiles sponsored byTetfund, presentation of which was attended by Chairman of the Press Management Committee in 2022/2023, which gave the APC and the Press publicity within and outside the University. The project sharpened the expertise of the University staff. Despite challenges involved in the project it was a huge success.
- 3. Editorial Committee: The Press Management Committee has formed an Editorial Committee headed by a Chairman which is answerable to the Press Management Committee. The Editorial Committee drew its membership from across faculties and colleges of the university and has started work in earnest.
- 4. It took the management committee a great deal of effort and resources to put the APC to working condition in terms of water works, electric fittings, security, sewages etc.
- 5. The committee has ensured prompt payment of taxes to the FIRS in collaboration with the Bursary Department.
- 6. The committee has realized through water engineers who carried out water treatment of APC that the water facility in the center can comfortably accommodate a commercial water production plant which it prays the University Management will endorse.

Staff

Currently, the University Press Ltd has staff strength of twelve (12) personnel. These include the Manager, Accountant, Senior Binding Officer, Two Operators, Two Binding Assistants, Two Casual Staff, One Security Man and a Driver.

The University Press has three divisions:

- 1) Computer/Lithographic
- 2) Printing
- 3) Binding

Expenditure

Expenditure in the University Press Ltd is divided into two categories; cash expenditure and non-cash expenditure. The cash expenditure items cover renovation, salaries and wages and miscellaneous overheads, like maintenance of machine/equipment, part time payments, fuelling of office vehicle and generators. Non cash expenditure contains depreciation of equipment and machines owned by the University Press.

Source(s) of Revenue

The University Press Ltd provides a range of services with potential focus on printing, job orders, as they may be received. Job orders are usually received. The Press tries to reach out to individuals and organizations within and outside the University. The Press enjoys patronage from the university community as well as the public. These include departments, faculties, schools, centres, journals and the units.

University Press Management Committee

The University Press is supervised by a management committee drawn from the University staff (academic and non-academic), appointed by the Vice Chancellor for the purpose of day to day running of the Press. The Management Committee is headed by a chairman.

Profile

The Usmanu Danfodiyo University Guest Inn was incorporated with certificate of incorporation No.: RC 91456. The main objective of the facility is to provide hotel and catering services as a source of revenue for the University. The company is wholly owned and financed by Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto. Apart from the Main University Guest Inn located at No. 1, Gidado Road, Mabera Area, Sokoto, the Guest Inn also manages the UDUS Kano Guest House located at No. 23B, Magajin Rumfa Road, Nasarawa GRA, Kano. However, by the decision of the 166th University Governing Council at its meeting held on 11th May, 2022, Kano Guest Inn annex was leased out for a ten (10) year period and the property was officially taken over on the 31st January, 2024.

Management Profile

The University Management appoints Management Board to serve for a specified period to supervise the running of the affairs of the Guest Inn. The current composition of the Board is as follows:

- Hotel and Catering Services: The University Guest Inn provides hotel and catering services to the University guests and outside customers. It also provides catering services to the University Community as well as individuals and organizations within Sokoto and its environs.
- Bread Bakery: The Guest Inn currently stocks freshly baked bread for sale in local stores and road stands. The bread is rated among the best in Sokoto metropolis. The galloping inflation in the country has adversely affected the



production and sales, but this notwithstanding, the Management has restructured operations of the unit with a view to improving the situation.

Patronage

The Guest Inn services the University as well as the general public. Many customers deliberately choose the facility because of its serene environment and adherence to morally and culturally acceptable norms and values of its immediate community.

Staffing Position

The Guest Inn has a total of 22 staff (skilled and un-skilled), headed by the Manager, that are spread across the various units of the facility.

- viii.24-hour laundry services
- ix. 3 no. Electricity generating plants (200 KVA & 150 KVA which are non-functional and a Maxmech gasoline which is functional).
- x. 1 Functional borehole
- xi. 2 utility vehicles (one functional, the other under repairs)

Financial Matters

- i. **Accounting Records**: In recognition of the importance of accountability for stewardship, The University Guest inn maintains up-to-date and adequate financial records necessary to record and report its financial transactions.
- ii. **Bank Account**: The Guest inn operates Current Accounts with Polaris Bank Main Branch along Birnin Kebbi Road and the Zenith Bank, along Emir Yahaya Road. Sokoto.
- iii. **Audit**: Since inception, the University Guest Inn has been presenting its financial records to external Auditors for Audit exercise. The Account of Guest Inn has been audited up to 31st December, 2023.



Current Strategy and Business Plan for the Guest Inn

Our overall mission for the 2023/2024 financial year is to enhance the competitive market position for the Guest Inn, improve on our facilities and products for enhanced guest satisfaction, and increase revenue generation above the level of achievement in the preceding year.

Within the framework that this objective provides, the facility has also developed detailed strategies that will provide the means for us to achieve our goals.

Bakery Business

In the effort to broaden the revenue base of the University Guest Inn so as not to continue to depend on the income from its present sources (accommodation and feeding), the University Guest Inn Management Board came up with the idea of establishing a bakery to serve as alternative source of income.

The bakery business commenced operation in January 2017, and was registered with NAFDAC REG. No.: SO-0019B/SRZ, and other regulatory agencies for its operations. Due to the economic meltdown the country was experiencing, the bakery business still experiences some difficulties which are gradually being addressed by the Guest Inn Management so as to sustain its capacity and capability in the competitive market.

Registration of the University Guest Inn

It is worthy of mention that the registration of the University Guest Inn as a limited liability company is yet to be completed, especially the appointment of directors and allotment of shares. It is advised that university Management through its Directorate of Investment, should expedite action in completing the registration, so that the facility can enjoy the benefit of a limited liability company including attracting bank facilities and partnering with other investors with the aim of turning around the revenue generation capacity of the Guest Inn.

Achievements

The current Guest Inn Management has recorded modest achievements, some of which can be summarised below.

- i. Restructuring of the Guest Inn by downsizing of staff from the inherited forty two (42) to twenty two (22).
- ii. Regular payment of staff salaries.
- iii. A limited window for soft loans to staff.
- iv. Cutting the Administrative cost to a manageable limit.
- v. Settlement of almost 98% of individual and corporate debts owed by the Guest Inn.
- vi. Resumption of and regular payments of service charges to staff.
- vii. Procurement of 12, 000 KVI generator as additional backup for the Guest Inn alternative power supply.
- viii. Effort at resuscitating the bakery business after its near collapse to its current enviable height.
- ix. Building confidence between the Guest Inn Management and the University.

Profile

The university auditorium was established in 2013 following the movement of the university main library to its new building. The auditorium came into full operation in September 2014 after complete renovation and necessary repairs had been carried out as well as provisions of relevant facilities and equipment had been made. The auditorium, since inception, has been managed by a management committee made up of several professionals and specialists. Quite recently, however, the auditorium has been assigned as a functional unit of the Directorate of Investment.


