



DANFODIYO UNIVERSITY GETS NEW VC

he Governing Council of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto has approved the appointment of Professor Bashir Garba MFR as the new Vice Chancellor.

In a statement signed by the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Council, Professor Attahiru Muhammad Jega, OFR, the appointment was approved during the 168th (Special) meeting of the Council held on 14th August, 2024.

According to the statement, the appointment was for a single term of five (5) years with effect from 1st September, 2024, when Professor Bashir Garba was expected to assume duty.

Professor Bashir Garba, a staff of Usmanu Danfodiyo University released on Leave of

Absence to Sokoto State University, was born on 6th June, 1966. He attended University of Sokoto (now Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto), and University of Jos where he obtained Bachelor of Science (B.Sc) in Applied Chemistry and Masters Degree in Applied Organic Chemistry in 1988 and 1994 respectively. Thereafter, he obtained Ph.D in Applied Chemistry at Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, in 1998.

Professor who is an indigene of Sokoto South Local Government area of Sokoto State, started his working career as a Graduate Assistant at Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto in 1989. He rose through the ranks and became a Professor in 2002.

During the period, Professor Garba held some administrative positions within and outside the University. They include Vice Chancellor of Sokoto State University from My, 2022 to the date of his new appointment, Commissioner and member

of the Sokoto State Executive Council from June to January, 2022, Secretary to Sokoto State Government from September, 2015 to May, 2019; Rector Polytechnic of Sokoto State from August, 2012 to September, 2015, Director at Energy Commission of Nigeria (ECN) from April, 2006 to March, 2010 and Director, Sokoto Energy Research Centre (SERC) from August 1999 to 2005.

The new VC was also at various times Chairman or member of many committees within and outside the University.

Pormer Chairman of Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Professor Attahiru Jega has been appointed as Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto.


Professor Jega who had since assumed duty was recently appointed along with several other Pro-Chancellors of Federal Universities across the country. A onetime Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano and a former President of the formidable Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), Professor Jega also

held several positions within and outside the University system.

Born in 1957, Professor Jega attended Sabon Gari Town Primary School Jega from 1963 to 1969. He attended Government Secondary School Birnin Kebbi where he obtained WASC and GCE O`Level in 1974. From there, Jega proceeded to the then Bayero University College, Kano for Advanced Level Certificate Studies as prelude to his undergraduate studies. In 1978, he graduated with Bachelor of Science Degree (Hon) in Political Science from Bayero University, Kano.

After National youth Service Corps in 1979, Jega took up appointment as Graduate Assistant at BUK; and thereafter, proceeded to Northwestern University Evanston, Illinois USA where he obtained Masters degree (1981 and Doctorate (1984) in Political Science - specializing in Political Economy.

With commitment, dedication and industry, Jega rose through the ranks to become a professor of political science. He was saddled with numerous responsibilities which culminated into his appointment as Deputy Vice Chancellor in

1995 and, eventually Vice Chancellor of the University in 2004.

Prior to his appointment as Vice Chancellor, Jega became a household name since during his tenure as National President of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) because of his doggedness for the survival of university system in Nigeria. His activism and negotiation skills as a union leader led to agreement with government that all companies in the country should pay education tax; which later resulted into the establishment of Education Tax Fund (ETF), and now TETFund through a decree in 1993.

Positions held by the new Pro-Chancellor are Visiting Research Fellow, University of Stockholm, Sweden, Director of Research, Nigerian Political Science Association, Visiting Research Fellow, St. Peter's College, University of Oxford, Chairman, Governing Board of the National Youth Service Corps, Member, Governing Board, National Institute for Policy and Strategic Studies (NIPSS) Kuru and Chairman, Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) among others.

he Management of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, has commenced preparations towards successful celebration of 50th anniversary of the University come 2025.

Usmanu Danfodiyo

University, Sokoto, which until the change of its name in 1988, was known as University of Sokoto, is one of the second generation Universities established by Federal Government in 1975 along with six others across the country. These Universities became popularly known as 'the Second Generation Universities`.

They are Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, University of Maiduguri, University of Port Harcourt, Bayero University Kano, University of Calabar, University of Jos and University of Ilorin. Professor Shehu Galadanci was the first Vice Chancellor of the UDUS.

UDUCONS GOVERNING BOARD RECONSTITUTED

new Governing Board of Usmanu Danfodiyo University Consultancy Services (UDUCONS) has been reconstituted. The appointment of the new board was sequel to the expiration of the tenure of the former members of the board.

Terms of reference of the Board are to establish guidelines for the overall operations of UDUCONS, subject to the general direction and approval of the Vice Chancellor; to design training for consideration by appropriate bodies and to approve budget estimates for UDUCONS and any other supplementary budget where necessary.

Others are to consider annual report and progress report from the Director of the Consultancy Services; to consider auditor's reports for recommendation to the University Management, to advise the University on matters concerning for functions of the Consultancy.

Members of the Board are Director UDUCONS, Professor Aliyu Jibril of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Malam A. B. Sani of Department of Accounting, Malam Shehu Aliyu of Bursary Department while the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration) Professor M. M. Maishanu will serve as Chairman and UDUCONS Secretary as Secretary of the Board.

STAFF OF UDUS ENJOY FREE TRANSPORT

ollowing the sharp increase in fuel price and its subsequent impact on staff transportation cost, the Management of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, has provided a free bus shuttle service to its staff.

In a circular addressed to the University Transport Officer, the Management said the bus service which is to operate once daily between the City and Main Campuses, is to run at the start and end of the workday to facilitate convenient transportation of staff.

In a related development, the University has granted a 100% waiver of registration fees to all category of staff (Academic and Non Academic) enrolled in approved Study Fellowship programmes within the University. The approval is with effect from the 2024/2025 academic session.

The statement further said the decision was a testament to the University's commitment to supporting its staff in their academic pursuits.

he Female Support Association in Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, has urged the management of the University to give more leadership positions to female staff for adequate representation and gender balance.

Chairperson of the Association Professor Asiyatu. A. serve as not only lecturers but as mothers, role models and mentors". She said the Association extend similar services to women in the villages around the University.

While appreciating the land given to the Association by the University on which a befitting Child Centre was built by a good Samaritan, Prof. Asiyatu solicited for more support from the University to make the Centre well equipped. She also requested for funds, furniture, equipment and fence to prevent the land from encouragement.

edical and Dental Consultants Association of Nigeria (MDCAN), Usmanu Danfodiyo University Teaching Hospital Sokoto has urged the new Vice Chancellor of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, Professor Bashir Garba to hasten the completion of transfer of service of 2nd batch of its members into academics as contained in the memoranda of understanding it entered into with the University.

He charged them to be up and doing to ensure smooth sail of accreditation of all programmes run by the College.

The Vice Chancellor also urged the medics to join hands with the University towards a successful hosting of the 50th anniversary of the institution.



PROF. JEGA DECRIES POOR FUNDING OF EDUCATION IN NIGERIA

he Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, Professor Attahiru Muhammadu Jega has decried the poor funding of education in Nigeria.

Professor Jega who stated this at the maiden convocation lecture of Federal University, Birnin Kebbi recalled that the regional governments of Nigeria in the past allocated 40 percent of their budgets

to education sector.

Jega who was chairman of the occasion, advised that in order to prevent decay in infrastructural facilities in Nigerian Universities and relieve Tetfund of the burden of executing capital projects in many of the Universities, the government must increase budgetary allocation to education sector.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor of the

The Imo State Governor Hope Uzodinma who presented the lecture, challenged the university administrations to embrace innovation, seek for new funding sources and manage resources with utmost effeciency and transfarency.


VC TASKS UDUS PROFESSORS ON INAUGURAL LECTURE

he Vice Chancellor of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, Professor Bashir Garba has challenged Professors in the University who are yet to present their inaugural lectures to do so with earnest.

Professor Bashir Garba gave the charge in his opening remarks during the 50th Inaugural Lecture delivered by Professor Ahmed Bako of the Department of History, Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto at the University auditorium.

Professor Garba explained that presentation of inaugural lecture enables a professor to prove his mettle, by telling the academic community and general public the direction of his or her research; and its contribution to the society.

He said with his appointment as Vice Chancellor of UDUS, inaugural lecture has come to stay in the University. He advocated that a professor should be able to present such lecture within one year after attaining professorship, which he said is a new hierarchy in the academia.

While commending Professor Ahmed Bako for presenting his lecture, the Vice Chancellor described him as a very experienced lecturer who has become a family name in the committee of historians in Nigeria and beyond. He noted that Professor Bako is one of the senior lecturers in the University who spent about four decades imparting knowledge.

He said the lecture titled "The Igbo Factor In the History of Intergroup Relations and

Commerce in Kano: Opportunities and Challenged Revised", would encourage commercial relationship between Igbos and people of Kano State. The VC also welcomed all the audience including Igbo community who graced the occasion.

During the lecture, Professor Bako traced the history of Igbo settlement in Kano, their life activities before and after the Nigerian civil war and their entrepreneurship life style.

SCH. OF MED. LAB. REQUESTS FOR MORE STAFF, FUNDING

he Director of School of Medical Laboratory Sciences, Professor M. H. Yeldu has made an urgent request for additional academic and technical staff to meet the growing demands of the School and its programmes.

Professor Yeldu made the appeal when he led a delegation from five departments under the School to congratulate the newly elected Vice Chancellor of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, Professor Bashir Garba.

Professor Yeldu also explained that the School was in dire need of a postgraduate research laboratory, multipurpose laboratory of 150 seat capacity and additional lecture theaters to accommodate the increasing students populaion.

Additionally, Yeldu informed the Vice Chancellor that there was serious need for increased funding for both first and final professional examinations to meet the need of increasing cost of reagents and laboratory consumables. He said the two examinations in addition to the Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Science (BMLS) degree form the basis upon which licenses are given to graduates of the School to practice as medical laboratory scientists.

Other challenges enumerated by the Director were the need for general repairs of laboratory complex which was having structural damages such as cracks, broken tiles, faulty water supply and electrical fittings.

However, Professor Yeldu explained that the School has received full accreditation from both the National Universities Commission (NUC) and Medical Laboratory Science Council of Nigeria (MLSCN), which was renewed in 2022 for a period of five years.

While responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Bashir Garba expressed delight for the visit and promised to look into all issues raised by the Director.

FACULTY OF LAW: DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

he Faculty of Law is pleased to present several new developments aimed at enhancing favourable academic environment for teaching and learning. The following ae key issues for reference;

1. Publication of UDUS Law Journals

PROF. JIYA APPOINTED DIRECTOR INSTITUTE OF CHILD HEALTH

equel to the approval given for the establishment of Institute of Child Health by the Senate of the University at its 361st meeting held on Thursday 6th June, 2024, the Vice Chancellor has approved the appointment of Professor N. M. Jiya as the Director of the Institute. The appointment is for the initial term of 2 years with effect from 20th June, 2024. The Director is requested to liase with the CMD of UDUTH, Provost College of Health Sciences and the Dean Faculty of Clinical Sciences for the establishment of the Institute in the College of Health Sciences.

Scope of the programme which is intended to be undertaken at the Institute shall go far beyond the limits of the classical Oslerian Concept of the bedside care of the sick. It would also involve the Unitive care of the child in health and in sickness in relation to its total environment, the extent of which shall include its physical, emotional, cultural, social and economic aspects. To reflect this situation, therefore, ICH shall embrace, in addition to Therapeutic Health Care [Paediatrics], such other sub- division as Public/environment, social and preventive Health Care, which in the current concept of Child Health Care, especially as it applies to the developing countries, are of greater long-term significance. In 2022, 4.9 million children under 5 years of age died. This translates to 13,400 children under the age of 5 dying every day in 2022. Globally, Infectious diseases, including pneumonia, diarrhoea and malaria, remain a leading cause of under-five deaths, along with Neglected

Tropical Diseases (NTDs).

Recently, in Sokoto State, there was an outbreak of a mysterious disease among children that is associated with high morbidity and Mortality. This requires quick and rigorous research to identify the root cause of the condition and finding novel treatment of the disease. With its establishment, the Institute will engage in research, training and medical services in order to improve survival of the children and reduce infants and childhood morbidity and mortality.

he One Health Institute at Usmanu Danfodiyo University (UDU) Sokoto is a pioneering institution dedicated to advancing health through an integrated approach that

considers the interconnectedness of human, animal, and environmental health. Led by Dr. Bello Arkilla Magaji, the Institute aims to address complex health challenges in northern Nigeria and beyond, focusing on issues such as emerging and re-merging infectious diseases, zoonotic diseases, antimicrobial resistance, and ecosystem health.

The Institute unites experts from various fields— public health, veterinary medicine, agriculture, Geography, ecology, and social sciences—to develop holistic solutions to health challenges. It emphasizes collaboration, conducting community-based initiatives that educate, prevent, and control disease outbreaks, with a particular focus on rural and underserved communities.

The One Health Institute is renowned for its unique initiative of establishing a Master of One Health (MOH) Degree program the first of its kind in the country. 

MILESTONE ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE TETFUND CENTRE OF **EXCELLENCE IN UROLOGY AND NEPHROLOGY, USMANU DANFODIYO UNIVERSITY, SOKOTO, FROM 2020 TO 2024**

he accomplishments of the TETFund Centre of Excellence in Urology and Nephrology at Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, are hugely impressive and represent a significant advancement in healthcare, research, and training in Nigeria.

TETFund Center of Excellence in Urology and Nephrology (TCoE-UN) is one of the twelve pioneer Centers of Excellence established in Nigerian Universities by the fund. The Vision of the Centre is to be an International Centre of Excellence for promotion of research, invention, manpower development and state of the art treatment of common Urologic, Urogynaecologic and Kidney disorders. The Centre has a mandate to apply knowledge gained from research and clinical trials to improve Urologic, Urogynaecologic and Kidney disease care, and to halt medical tourism and capital flight from Nigeria.

The mission of the Centre is to conduct research, pursue manpower development and advance the frontiers of knowledge via training and retraining, and render services of international standard to the teeming population of Urology, Urogynaecology and Kidney disorder patients and clientele. The Centre shall pursue manpower development by mounting training at PhD, Fellowship, MSc, Postgraduate Diploma, Post Basic and Post Fellowship levels, in addition to workshops, seminars and short courses. Other research priority areas include validation of clinical protocols and practice guidelines, as well as development of novel

therapeutics in the management of Urological conditions and kidney diseases.

SERVICES

The Centre has a comprehensive Endourologic and Laparoscopic tower for Scar-less and Keyhole Urethral, Prostate, Bladder, Ureteric and Kidney surgery. Kidney stones, bladder stones and prostate enlargement can be treated using digital state of the art equipment including laser. Many diseases of the urinary tract can be treated endoscopically or using laparoscopy without the need to open. The Centre also permits general surgeons to perform laparoscopic surgeries such as Cholecystectomy, appendicectomy, and herniorrhaphy among other procedures. This fills a significant gap in healthcare services within Nigeria.

The Centre has equipment and expertise for complex inter-sex and sex reassignment surgery. This is performed for individuals with disorders of sex development (True hermaphrodites and pseudohermaphrodite). We exclude transgender individuals from this procedure for medico legal reasons. We have referral from all over the country for this procedure because ours is the only Centre with vast experience on intersex surgery in Nigeria. This is a great feat because Intersex surgery was hitherto not available in the country.

The Centre has acquired transplant facilities and is now fully equipped to conduct Kidney Transplant in collaboration with the prestigious University of Mansoura Egypt. Recruitment of patients for same has already commenced. TCoE-UN has sponsored training of Urologists, Nephrologists, Nurses, and other relevant staffs on Kidney Transplant at University of Mansoura Egypt as a component of MoU signed with the

institution to assist TCoE-UN establish services and training on Kidney Transplant. In September 2023, the University of Mansoura sent a team lead by the head of their transplant programme, Professor Bedeir Ali-El-Dein El-Baz to assess our preparedness. They are satisfied with our preparation and will be joining us for the first transplant once the recruitment process is complete. We plan a sustainable transplant programme, not occasional procedure.



Kidney Transplant Instrumentation Training (In-house)



This Centre is already contributing to curbing medical and training tourism, thus reducing capital flight from Nigeria. Register of more than 120 patients halted from going outside the country for surgery over the last 3 years is verifiably available at the Centre. This is a big saving to individual families and Nigeria at large. The local training of physicians, surgeons and nurses conducted by the Centre also helps to reduce capital flight from Nigeria.

TRAINING

In addition to residency training in Urology and Nephrology the Centre has mounted post fellowship training in Urethral and Genital Reconstruction. New programmes at the Masters and PhD levels in Urology and Urology Nursing have been initiated. Additionally, the Professional Post Graduate Diploma in Urology Nursing

has commenced. This is the only professional urology nursing programme in Africa. The Centre conducts short training courses on Laparoscopic surgery, urology ultrasonography, percutaneous nephrolithotomy and others. Nigerian surgeons are spared of the trouble of traveling outside the country to acquire these skills. Testimony from trainees that attended laparoscopy course revealed that many have established such services in their hospitals across the Country.

The Centre is accredited for residency training in urology by both National Post Graduate Medical college and West African College of Surgeons. TCoE-UN has commenced Post Fellowship Training in Urethral and Genital Reconstruction and is the first and only Post Fellowship level urology training in Nigeria.

In addition to the strong partnership with University of Mansoura, Egypt, the Centre has also signed an MoU with University of Alberta, Canada to further strengthen Urology and Nephrology training and research. Monthly international seminar has already commenced with April inaugural edition delivered by distinguished speaker, Philip F. The centre is very active on publications. About forty (40) scientific papers have been published in index journals over the last three (3) years.

NUPEMCO MANAGER EXPLAINS WHY RETIREES PENSIONS ARE DELAYED

he Regional Manager of Nigerian University Pension Management Company (NUPEMCO) in charge of Northwest, Malam Abubakar Umar has debunked the claim that the federal government utilizes workers` pension for other purposes thereby causing delay in releasing retirees entitlements.

According to Umar, what causes delay in releasing retirees benefits was the fact that some workers were employed during old pension scheme prior to introduction of new pension scheme and therefore when a worker retires, pension providers have to wait for his share of money from government side before they merge it with what he contributed to his

new pension providers.

Umar who disclosed this during interactive session with staff of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, exonerated Nupemco and other pension providers under the new scheme from delay in releasing retirees benefits.

He said it was the responsibility of pension providers not only to accumulate workers pension contribution but also to advise them on how to plan their life after retirement. He counseled would-be retirees to ensure data recapture before their retirement for easy and prompt processing of their entitlement.

ABSENCE OF MECHANISMS FOR INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY PROTECTION WORRIES UDUS

he Management of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto, has expressed concern for lack of financial benefits for poets in traditional poetry in the University.
